Dear Congressman Reichert:

I am writing to express my strong support for the City of Renton's Surface Transportation Reauthorization High Priority Project Request for the SW 27th Street/Strander Boulevard Connection Project. We have greatly appreciated your support for this project in the past and appreciate your consideration of further support for project funding.

The SW 27th Street/Strander Boulevard Connection Project will create a critical east/west connection that is missing between SW 27th Street in Renton and Strander Boulevard in Tukwila, providing an alternate route to I-405 between I-5 and SR-167. The project promotes transit-oriented development and job creation in an area where 25,000-34,000 jobs are estimated to be located by 2030; addresses significant safety issues associated with pedestrians and commuters currently having to cross two sets of railroad tracks; removes 55,000 vehicles from I-405 and SR-167; eliminates 40% of traffic congestion on South 180th; increases use of Sounder commuter rail, Amtrak, and other mass transit modes; saves construction costs; and improves air quality.

This project will increase freight mobility by providing an alternate truck route and connecting the Tukwila urban center to the Renton/Tukwila industrial area, the regional I-5 freight bypass, and the Green River Valley. The Green River Valley is the largest industrial area in Washington State, the second largest distribution hub on the West Coast, and the fourth largest in the nation. The SW 27th Street/Strander Boulevard Connection Project is surrounded by significant major employers, including The Boeing Company, the Federal Aviation Administration, and the Federal Reserve Bank.

The City of Renton is deeply committed to an effective solicitation of public comment on this project. We have already held multiple meetings with area employers and will hold a public forum focused on the project. We intend to continue a high level of communication and outreach as this project unfolds, and will continue to incorporate feedback received in our project and construction planning.

The total cost of this project is \$38 million. Funding for previous phases has been secured from the Freight Mobility Strategic Investment Board (\$4,000,000); WSDOT - Mobility Funding (\$1,000,000); Sound Transit (\$2,300,000); and the cities of Renton and Tukwila (\$641,280).

Given the merit of this project, our commitment to public input and the other secured sources of funding, I strongly request that you make this project a high priority project in the upcoming Surface Transportation Reauthorization.
