Dear Mr. Reichert –

This letter is written on behalf of the citizens in the Town of Yarrow Point in support of our Stormwater Capital Improvement Project. The project will upgrade 4,985lf of aged and undersized stormwater pipe within the Town.

For over 2 years the Town has been successfully working towards identifying and completing projects related to upgrading its aging and undersized stormwater infrastructure. In 2008 we completed a Comprehensive Stormwater Management Plan (SWMP) which effectively inventoried the existing drainage system and provided recommendations for capital improvement projects based on the Town's 2004 Comprehensive Plan. In December 2009, we will complete the highest ranked project, CIP #3 – NE 47th Street, both on-time and on budget. The remaining CIP's (#1, #2 and #4) will be grouped together for design and construction purposes.

The final stormwater capital improvement project is similar in nature to CIP #3 in regards to design, permitting, and construction, but maintains two distinct differences: the potential for flooding existing sanitary sewer facilities and overall cost. Both gravity and pressure sanitary sewer lines, operated by the City of Bellevue Utilities Division, surround the Yarrow Point peninsula. On November 6, 2009, during an above average rainstorm, a blockage in the stormwater line caused the storm system to overflow near the west end of NE 42nd Street. The flows quickly flooded a downstream sanitary sewer lift station. The City of Bellevue wastewater crews acted immediately to remove the debris and only minor damage was recorded. It became rapidly evident however, that timely completion of our remaining CIP is a health risk to nearby residents and the vitality of Lake Washington. (Pictures of this event are attached to this letter.)

The estimated cost (\$1.5 million) for the remaining stormwater capital improvement project is another major concern. CIP #3 cost the Town of Yarrow Point roughly \$300,000. Although we

were able to pay for this project through prior years of saving, the Town's resources are not as vast as in most other jurisdictions. We have no commercial base and rely solely on real estate excise tax to operate. We cannot continue to pay for projects of this magnitude. We understand the urgency and responsibility to protect the adjacent Lake Washington shoreline however, and have budgeted \$40,000 for 2010 to complete the survey, design, and permitting phases of this project. We are asking for the remaining \$1,485,103 from the 2010 Water Resources Development Act (WRDA) to complete the construction and thereby ensure stormwater flows do not compromise the integrity of the surrounding sanitary sewer system. The minimum amount of Fiscal Year 2010 funding needed to meet our current estimated costs and project schedule is \$20,000.

Dear Ms. Schroeder,

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of a potential failure consequence related to Yarrow Point's 12-inch concrete stormwater pipeline that runs westward down NE 42nd Street to Lake Washington. We believe that if this stormwater pipeline were to fail near or above Bellevue's wastewater pump station in NE 42nd Street, the unpiPED stormwater could erode the ground surrounding the pump station, cause significant damage to the pump station, and result in the flow of raw sewage into Lake Washington. Since you have determined that this pipe has a high likelihood of failure, we support the decision that it should be rehabilitated or replaced so that it is more reliable. Please keep us apprised of your progress addressing this issue.
