H.R. 4330 – The All Students Achieving through Reform (All-STAR) Act

The All Students Achieving through Reform or All-STAR Act will enable and encourage topperforming public charter school models that get the job done to expand and replicate, and will also strengthen public charter school accountability and transparency. Now, more than ever, we need to reinvigorate America's education system and give each and every child the opportunity to learn and thrive.

What does All-STAR do?

- Establishes a new competitive grant program in the Department of Education to enable <u>successful</u> public charter schools that serve at-risk students to replicate, expand and serve more students who are currently in underperforming schools.
 - Eligible grantees include <u>School Districts</u> that have or intend to authorize a public charter school, <u>States</u>, <u>Authorized Public Chartering Agencies</u>, and <u>Non-Profit Organizations</u> with a mission and proven track record of success in replicating high-quality charter schools.
 - o Charter schools are eligible only if they have made Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) the last two consecutive years or exceeded their state graduation rate (where applicable).
- Encourages new <u>rigorous levels of reporting</u>, <u>oversight and accountability</u> for charter school authorizers, including intervention or closure of low-quality charter schools.
- Allows funds to be used for <u>replication and expansion costs</u>, including:
 - ✓ Transportation
 - ✓ Hiring additional staff and teachers
 - ✓ Special education programs
 - ✓ Facilities acquisition & development
- Requires that <u>students must be enrolled via a lottery</u> in charters, but also allows expanding schools to matriculate their current students into the new grades.
- <u>Focuses resources on serving those areas most in need</u> by giving priority to eligible entities that serve a large share of low-income students who are enrolled in underperforming schools.
- Gives <u>priority to states that do not have caps</u> restricting the growth of public charter schools and have policies in place that <u>support academically successful charter schools</u>, <u>provide autonomy</u> to schools, <u>promote strong authorizing policies</u>, and <u>ensure quality control</u> through performancebased accountability.

- <u>Focuses resources on replicating the best models of public education</u> by giving priority to topperforming charter schools that:
 - o Have significantly closed the achievement gap and:
 - Serve a large percentage of low-income students and rank in at least the top 25th percentile in the State assessment in math and reading or have an average student score on a national exam that is at least in the 60th percentile in reading and at least in the 75th percentile in math; or
 - Serve low-income students through a cooperative agreement.
