 - 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 2 3 That the following article is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which shall be 4 5 valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of 6 7 the several States within seven years after the date of its 8 submission for ratification:

"ARTICLE —

2 "SECTION 1. The right of citizens of the United
3 States to vote in the election for President and Vice Presi4 dent shall not be denied or abridged by the United States
5 or by any State on account of residency in a territory or
6 commonwealth of the United States.

7 "SECTION 2. The Congress shall have power to en-8 force this article by appropriate legislation.".
