FEMA ASSISTANCE IS AVAILABLE COLUMBUS DAY AND AFTER

DOWNERS GROVE, Ill. – Disasters don't take a holiday and neither will the staff at the Disaster Recovery Centers (DRCs) operating in Freeport, Cicero, Westchester, Chicago State University and the Austin area of Chicago. The centers will be open Monday through Saturday, **including Columbus Day**, from **9 a.m. to 7 p.m.**, until further notice.

Online application services are available 24/7 at www.disasterassistance.gov, or call 1-800-621-3362. TTY users call 1-800-462-7585. Phone lines are open 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. every day of the week, including Columbus Day.

DRCs are operated jointly by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA). More than 13,000 residents have visited a DRC as of Oct. 6. They find information there on:

- FEMA and State disaster assistance programs
- U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) low-interest disaster loans and how to complete a loan application, including one-on-one help with the forms
- Cost-effective, smart building techniques to reduce damage from future floods
- Flood insurance

Applying is the first step toward disaster recovery. Individuals can apply online any day of the week at www.DisasterAssistance.gov or call **1-800-621-3362** from **7 a.m. to 10 p.m.** daily. TTY users may call **1-800-462-7585**. Phone assistance is available in many languages.

Completing the SBA application is an essential part of the process of applying for FEMA disaster grants. Homeowners and renters who cannot afford a loan may be referred back to FEMA for possible additional grant assistance. Applicants are not required to take out a loan if one is offered to them.
