Mr. MCGOVERN, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 4785) to amend the miscellaneous rural development provisions of the Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002 to authorize the Secretary of Agriculture to make loans to certain entities that will use the funds to make loans to consumers to implement energy efficiency measures involving structural improvements and investments in cost-effective, commercial off-the-shelf technologies to reduce home energy use.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 4785) to amend the miscellaneous
6 rural development provisions of the Farm Security and
7 Rural Investment Act of 2002 to authorize the Secretary
8 of Agriculture to make loans to certain entities that will
9 use the funds to make loans to consumers to implement
10 energy efficiency measures involving structural improve-
11 ments and investments in cost-effective, commercial off-
12 the-shelf technologies to reduce home energy use. The first
13 reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of
14 order against consideration of the bill are waived except
15 those arising under clause 9 or 10 of rule XXI. General
16 debate shall be confined to the bill and amendments speci-
17 fied in this resolution and shall not exceed one hour equal-
18 ly divided among and controlled by the chair and ranking
19 minority member of the Committee on Agriculture and the
20 chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on
21 Energy and Commerce. After general debate the bill shall
22 be considered for amendment under the five-minute rule.
23 In lieu of the amendment in the nature of a substitute
24 recommended by the Committee on Agriculture now print-
25 ed in the bill, it shall be in order to consider as an original

1 bill for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute
2 rule the amendment in the nature of a substitute printed
3 in part A of the report of the Committee on Rules accom-
4 panying this resolution. That amendment in the nature
5 of a substitute shall be considered as read. All points of
6 order against that amendment in the nature of a sub-
7 stitute are waived except those arising under clause 10
8 of rule XXI. Notwithstanding clause 11 of rule XVIII, no
9 amendment to that amendment in the nature of a sub-
10 stitute shall be in order except those printed in part B
11 of the report of the Committee on Rules. Each amendment
12 may be offered only in the order printed in the report,
13 may be offered only by a Member designated in the report,
14 shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time
15 specified in the report equally divided and controlled by
16 the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to
17 amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand for divi-
18 sion of the question. All points of order against such
19 amendments are waived except those arising under clause
20 9 or 10 of rule XXI. At the conclusion of consideration
21 of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise and
22 report the bill to the House with such amendments as may
23 have been adopted. The previous question shall be consid-
24 ered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to

1 final passage without intervening motion except one mo-
2 tion to recommit with or without instructions.

3 SEC. 2. The Chair may entertain a motion that the
4 Committee rise only if offered by the chair of the Com-
5 mittee on Agriculture or his designee. The Chair may not
6 entertain a motion to strike out the enacting words of the
7 bill (as described in clause 9 of rule XVIII).

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
