Mr. MCGOVERN, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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# RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the Senate amendments to the bill (H.R. 4899) making emergency supplemental appropriations for disaster relief and summer jobs for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2010, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it  
2 shall be in order to take from the Speaker's table the bill  
3 (H.R. 4899) making emergency supplemental appropria-  
4 tions for disaster relief and summer jobs for the fiscal year  
5 ending September 30, 2010, and for other purposes, with

1 the Senate amendments thereto, and to consider in the  
2 House, without intervention of any point of order except  
3 those arising under clause 10 of rule XXI, a motion of-  
4 fered by the chair of the Committee on Appropriations or  
5 his designee that the House concur in the Senate amend-  
6 ment to the text with each of the five House amendments  
7 printed in the report of the Committee on Rules accom-  
8 panying this resolution. The Senate amendments and the  
9 motion shall be considered as read. The motion shall be  
10 debatable for one hour and 30 minutes as follows: 30 min-  
11 utes equally divided and controlled by the chair and rank-  
12 ing minority member of the Committee on Appropriations;  
13 then 30 minutes equally divided and controlled by Rep-  
14 resentative Lee of California or her designee and an oppo-  
15 nent; and then 30 minutes equally divided and controlled  
16 by Representative McGovern of Massachusetts or his des-  
17 ignee and an opponent. The previous question shall be  
18 considered as ordered on the motion to final adoption  
19 without intervening motion or demand for division of the  
20 question except that the question of adoption of the mo-  
21 tion shall be divided among the five House amendments.  
22 The first portion of the divided question shall be consid-  
23 ered as adopted. If the remaining portions of the divided  
24 question fail of adoption, then the House shall be consid-

1 ered to have rejected the motion and to have made no dis-  
2 position of the Senate amendment to the text.

3 SEC. 2. Upon adoption of the motion specified in the  
4 first section of this resolution—

5 (a) the Clerk shall engross the action of the House  
6 under that section as a single amendment; and

7 (b) a motion that the House concur in the Senate  
8 amendment to the title shall be considered as adopted.

9 SEC. 3. The chair of the Committee on Appropria-  
10 tions may insert in the Congressional Record not later  
11 than July 3, 2010, such material as he may deem explana-  
12 tory of the Senate amendments and the motion specified  
13 in the first section of this resolution.

14 SEC. 4. House Resolution 1493 is hereby adopted.

15 SEC. 5. Clause 10(a) of rule XXI is amended to read  
16 as follows:

17 “(a)(1) Except as provided in paragraphs (b) and (c),  
18 it shall not be in order to consider any bill, joint resolu-  
19 tion, amendment, or conference report if the provisions of  
20 such measure affecting direct spending and revenues have  
21 the net effect of increasing the on-budget deficit or reduc-  
22 ing the on-budget surplus for the period comprising ei-  
23 ther—

24 “(A) the current year, the budget year, and the  
25 four years following that budget year; or

1           “(B) the current year, the budget year, and the  
2           nine years following that budget year.

3           “(2) The effect of such measure on the deficit or sur-  
4 plus shall be determined on the basis of estimates made  
5 by the Committee on the Budget relative to baseline esti-  
6 mates supplied by the Congressional Budget Office con-  
7 sistent with section 257 of the Balanced Budget and  
8 Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 and consistent  
9 with sections 3(4), 3(8), and 4(c) of the Statutory Pay-  
10 As-You-Go Act of 2010.

11          “(3) For the purpose of this clause, the terms ‘budget  
12 year’, ‘current year’, and ‘direct spending’ have the mean-  
13 ings specified in section 250 of the Balanced Budget and  
14 Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, except that the  
15 term ‘direct spending’ shall also include provisions in ap-  
16 propriation Acts that make outyear modifications to sub-  
17 stantive law as described in section 3(4)(C) of the Statu-  
18 tory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010.’.”.



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
