AN ACT

To amend section 1113 of the Social Security Act to provide authority for increased fiscal year 2010 payments for temporary assistance to United States citizens returned from foreign countries, to provide necessary funding to avoid shortfalls in the Medicare cost-sharing program for low-income qualifying individuals, and for other purposes.

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Emergency Aid to
5 American Survivors of the Haiti Earthquake Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. INCREASE IN AGGREGATE PAYMENTS FOR FISCAL**
7 **YEAR 2010 FOR TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE TO**
8 **UNITED STATES CITIZENS RETURNED FROM**
9 **FOREIGN COUNTRIES.**

10 Section 1113(d) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
11 1313(d)) is amended by striking “September, 30, 2003”
12 and all that follows and inserting “September 30, 2009,
13 except that, in the case of fiscal year 2010, the total
14 amount of such assistance provided during that fiscal year
15 shall not exceed \$25,000,000.”.

16 **SEC. 3. QI PROGRAM FUNDING.**

17 Section 1933(g)(2) of the Social Security Act (42
18 U.S.C. 1396u–3(g)(2)) is amended—

19 (1) in subparagraph (M), by striking
20 “\$412,500,000” and inserting “\$462,500,000”; and

21 (2) in subparagraph (N), by striking
22 “\$150,000,000” and inserting “\$165,000,000”.

1 **SEC. 4. APPLICATION OF MEDICAID IMPROVEMENT FUND.**

2 Section 1941(b)(1)(A) of the Social Security Act (42
3 U.S.C. 1396w-1(b)(1)(A)) is amended by striking
4 “\$100,000,000” and inserting “\$10,000,000”.
