3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the "Occupational Safety

7 SEC. 2. JUDICIAL DEFERENCE.

8 Section 11(a) of the Occupational Safety and Health 9 Act of 1970 (29 U.S.C. 660(a)) is amended in the sixth 10 sentence by inserting before the period the following: ", 11 and with respect to such record, the conclusions of the 12 Commission with respect to questions of law that are sub-13 ject to agency deference under governing court precedent 14 shall be given deference if reasonable".

15 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

16 This Act may be cited as the "Occupational Safety and
17 Health Independent Review of OSHA Citations Act of

19 SEC. 2. INDEPENDENT REVIEW.

20 Section 11(a) of the Occupational Safety and Health 21 Act of 1970 (29 U.S.C. 660) is amended by adding at the 22 end the following: "The conclusions of the Commission with 23 respect to all questions of law that are subject to agency

- 1 deference under governing court precedent shall be given
- 2 deference if reasonable.".
