- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION. 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "Education Land Grant
3	Act".

- 4 SEC. 2. CONVEYANCE OF NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM
- 5 LANDS FOR EDUCATIONAL PURPOSES.
- 6 (a) AUTHORITY TO CONVEY.—Upon application, the
- 7 Secretary of Agriculture may convey National Forest Sys-
- 8 tem lands for use for educational purposes if the Secretary
- 9 determines that—
- 10 (1) the entity seeking the conveyance will use 11 the conveyed land for a public or publicly funded ele-
- mentary or secondary school, to provide grounds or
- facilities related to such a school, or for both pur-
- poses;
- 15 (2) the conveyance will serve the public interest;
- 16 (3) the land to be conveyed is not otherwise
- 17 needed for the purposes of the National Forest Sys-
- tem; and
- 19 (4) the total acreage to be conveyed does not
- 20 exceed the amount reasonably necessary for the pro-
- 21 posed use.
- 22 (b) ACREAGE LIMITATION.—A conveyance under this
- 23 section may not exceed 80 acres. However, this limitation
- 24 shall not be construed to preclude an entity from submit-
- 25 ting a subsequent application under this section for an ad-

- 1 ditional land conveyance if the entity can demonstrate to
- 2 the Secretary a need for additional land.
- 3 (c) Costs and Mineral Rights.—A conveyance
- 4 under this section shall be for a nominal cost. The convey-
- 5 ance may not include the transfer of mineral rights.
- 6 (d) REVIEW OF APPLICATIONS.—When the Secretary
- 7 receives an application under this section, the Secretary
- 8 shall—
- 9 (1) before the end of the 14-day period begin-
- ning on the date of the receipt of the application,
- provide notice of that receipt to the applicant; and
- 12 (2) before the end of the 120-day period begin-
- ning on that date—
- 14 (A) make a final determination whether or
- not to convey land pursuant to the application,
- and notify the applicant of that determination;

- 18 (B) submit written notice to the applicant
- containing the reasons why a final determina-
- 20 tion has not been made.
- 21 (e) REVERSIONARY INTEREST.—If at any time after
- 22 lands are conveyed pursuant to this section, the entity to
- 23 whom the lands were conveyed attempts to transfer title
- 24 to or control over the lands to another or the lands are
- 25 devoted to a use other than the use for which the lands

- 1 were conveyed, without the consent of the Secretary, title
- 2 to the lands shall revert to the United States.
