23 For an additional amount for "Overseas Contingency 24 Operations Transfer Fund", \$5,219,100,000, to remain 25 available until expended: *Provided*, That the entire amount

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made available under this heading is designated by the 1 2 Congress as an emergency requirement pursuant to sec-3 tion 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency 4 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended: *Provided further*, 5 That of such amount, \$1,311,800,000 shall be available only to the extent that the President transmits to the Con-6 7 gress an official budget request for a specific dollar 8 amount that (1) specifies items which meet a critical read-9 iness or sustainability need, to include replacement of ex-10 pended munitions to maintain adequate inventories for future operations, and (2) includes designation of the entire 11 12 amount of the request as an emergency requirement as 13 defined in the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended: *Provided further*, That 14 15 the Secretary of Defense may transfer these funds only to military personnel accounts; operation and maintenance 16 17 accounts, including Overseas Humanitarian, Disaster, and 18 Civic Aid; procurement accounts; research, development, 19 test and evaluation accounts; military construction; the 20 Defense Health Program appropriation; the National De-21 fense Sealift Fund; and working capital fund accounts: 22 *Provided further*, That the funds transferred shall be 23 merged with and shall be available for the same purposes 24 and for the same time period, as the appropriation to 25 which transferred: *Provided further*, That the transfer au-

thority provided under this heading is in addition to any 1 2 other transfer authority available to the Department of 3 Defense: *Provided further*, That such funds may be used 4 to execute projects or programs that were deferred in 5 order to carry out military operations in and around Kosovo and in Southwest Asia, including efforts associated 6 7 with the displaced Kosovar population: *Provided further*, 8 That upon a determination that all or part of the funds 9 transferred from this appropriation are not necessary for 10 the purposes provided herein, such amounts may be transferred back to this appropriation. 11

For an additional amount for "Aircraft Procurement, Air Force", \$40,000,000, to remain available for obligation until September 30, 2000: *Provided*, That such amount is designated by the Congress as an emergency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Bal anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985,
 as amended.

12 PROCUREMENT OF AMMUNITION, AIR FORCE

For an additional amount for "Procurement of Ammunition, Air Force", \$35,000,000, to remain available for obligation until September 30, 2000: *Provided*, That such amount is designated by the Congress as an emergency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 19 1985, as amended.

20 OPERATIONAL RAPID RESPONSE TRANSFER FUND

21 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

In addition to the amounts appropriated or otherwise
made available in this Act and the Department of Defense
Appropriations Act, 1999 (Public Law 105–262),
\$400,000,000, to remain available for obligation until Sep-

tember 30, 2000, is hereby made available only for the 1 2 accelerated acquisition and deployment of military tech-3 nologies and systems needed for the conduct of Operation 4 Allied Force, or to provide accelerated acquisition and de-5 ployment of military technologies and systems as substitute or replacement systems for other U.S. regional 6 7 commands which have had assets diverted as a result of 8 Operation Allied Force: *Provided*, That funds under this 9 heading may only be obligated in response to a specific 10 request from a U.S. regional command and upon approval of the Secretary of Defense, or his designate: Provided fur-11 ther, That the Secretary of Defense shall provide written 12 13 notification to the congressional defense committees prior to the transfer of any amount in excess of \$10,000,000 14 15 to a specific program or project: *Provided further*, That the Secretary of Defense may transfer funds made avail-16 able under this heading only to operation and maintenance 17 18 accounts, procurement accounts, and research, development, test and evaluation accounts: *Provided further*, That 19 20 the transfer authority provided under this section shall be 21 in addition to the transfer authority provided to the De-22 partment of Defense in this Act or any other Act: *Provided* 23 *further*, That the entire amount made available in this section is designated by the Congress as an emergency re-24 25 quirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Bal-

anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, 1 as amended: *Provided further*, That the entire amount 2 3 shall be available only to the extent that an official budget 4 request for \$400,000,000, that includes designation of the 5 entire amount of the request as an emergency requirement as defined in the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit 6 7 Control Act of 1985, as amended, is transmitted by the 8 President to the Congress.

(TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

11 SEC. 201. Section 8005 of the Department of De-12 fense Appropriations Act, 1999 (Public Law 105–262), is 13 amended by striking out "\$1,650,000,000" and inserting 14 in lieu thereof "\$2,450,000,000".

15 SEC. 202. Notwithstanding the limitations set forth 16 in section 1006 of Public Law 105–261, not to exceed 17 \$10,000,000 of funds appropriated by this Act may be 18 available for contributions to the common funded budgets 19 of NATO (as defined in section 1006(c)(1) of Public Law 20 105–261) for costs related to NATO operations in and 21 around Kosovo.

SEC. 203. Funds appropriated by this Act, or made
available by the transfer of funds in this Act, for intelligence activities are deemed to be specifically authorized

by the Congress for purposes of section 504 of the Na tional Security Act of 1947 (50 U.S.C. 414).

3 SEC. 204. Notwithstanding section 5064(d) of the 4 Federal Acquisition Streamlining Act of 1994 (Public Law 5 103–355), the special authorities provided under section 5064(c) of such Act shall continue to apply with respect 6 7 to contracts awarded or modified for the Joint Direct At-8 tack Munition (JDAM) program until June 30, 2000: Pro-9 vided, That a contract or modification to a contract for 10 the JDAM program may be awarded or executed notwithstanding any advance notification requirements that would 11 otherwise apply. 12

13 TO 205.(a)EFFORTS SEC. INCREASE BURDENSHARING.—The President shall seek equitable re-14 imbursement from the North Atlantic Treaty Organization 15 (NATO), member nations of NATO, and other appro-16 17 priate organizations and nations for the costs incurred by the United States government in connection with Oper-18 19 ation Allied Force.

20 (b) REPORT.—Not later than September 30, 1999,
21 the President shall prepare and submit to the Congress
22 a report on—

23 (1) All measures taken by the President pursu-24 ant to subsection (a);

(2) The amount of reimbursement received to
 date from each organization and nation pursuant to
 subsection (a), including a description of any com mitments made by such organization or nation to
 provide reimbursement; and

6 (3) In the case of an organization or nation
7 that has refused to provide, or to commit to provide,
8 reimbursement pursuant to subsection (a), an expla9 nation of the reasons therefor.

(c) OPERATION ALLIED FORCE.—In this section, the
term "Operation Allied Force" means operations of the
North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) conducted
against the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and
Montenegro) during the period beginning on March 24,
1999, and ending on such date as NATO may designate,
to resolve the conflict with respect to Kosovo.

17 SEC. 206. (a) Not more than thirty days after the 18 enactment of this Act, the President shall transmit to 19 Congress a report, in both classified and unclassified form, 20 on current United States participation in Operation Allied 21 Force. The report should include information on the fol-22 lowing matters:

(1) A statement of the national security objectives involved in U.S. participation in Operation Allied Force;

1 (2) An accounting of all current active duty 2 personnel assigned to support Operation Allied Force and related humanitarian operations around 3 4 Kosovo to include total number, service component 5 and area of deployment (such accounting should also 6 include total number of personnel from other NATO 7 countries participating in the action); 8 (3) Additional planned deployment of active 9 duty units in the European Command area of oper-10 ations to support Operation Allied Force, between 11 the date of enactment of this Act and the end of fis-12 cal year 1999; 13 (4) Additional planned Reserve component mo-14 bilization, including specific units to be called up be-15 tween the date of enactment of this Act and the end 16 of fiscal year 1999, to support Operation Allied 17 Force; 18 (5) An accounting by the Joint Chiefs of Staff 19 on the transfer of personnel and materiel from other 20 regional commands to the United States European 21 Command to support Operation Allied Force and re-22 lated humanitarian operations around Kosovo, and 23 an assessment by the Joint Chiefs of Staff of the 24 impact any such loss of assets has had on the warfighting capabilities and deterrence value of these
 other commands;

3 (6) Levels of humanitarian aid provided to the
4 displaced Kosovar community from the United
5 States, NATO member nations, and other nations
6 (figures should be provided by country and type of
7 assistance provided whether financial or in-kind);
8 and

9 (7) Any significant revisions to the total cost 10 estimate for the deployment of United States forces 11 involved in Operation Allied Force through the end 12 of fiscal year 1999.

(b) OPERATION ALLIED FORCE.—In this section, the
term "Operation Allied Force" means operations of the
North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) conducted
against the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and
Montenegro) during the period beginning on March 24,
1999, and ending on such date as NATO may designate,
to resolve the conflict with respect to Kosovo.

SEC. 207. In addition to amounts appropriated or otherwise made available elsewhere in this Act for the Department of Defense or in the Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 1999, \$1,339,200,000, to remain available for obligation until September 30, 2000, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Defense only for spare

and repair parts and associated logistical support nec-1 2 essary for the maintenance of weapons systems and equip-3 ment, as follows: 4 "Operation and Maintenance, Navy", 5 \$457,000,000; 6 "Operation and Maintenance, Air Force". 7 \$676,800,000; 8 "Operation and Maintenance, Air Force Re-9 serve", \$24,000,000; "Operation and Maintenance, Air National 10 11 Guard", \$26,000,000; "Aircraft Procurement, Navy", \$118,000,000; 12 13 "Aircraft Procurement, Air Force", 14 \$31,300,000; and 15 "Missile Procurement, Air Force", \$6,100,000:

CHAPTER 5

GENERAL PROVISION

3 SEC. 501. No part of any appropriation contained in
4 the Act shall remain available for obligation beyond the
5 current fiscal year unless expressly so provided herein.

6 SEC. 502. It is the sense of the Congress that there 7 should continue to be parity between the adjustments in 8 the compensation of members of the uniformed services 9 and the adjustments in the compensation of civilian em-10 ployees of the United States.
