

On behalf of the County of San Diego I am writing to express our support of funding for widening Otay Mesa Road through the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) Reauthorization High Priority Project (HPP) request program.

The Otay Mesa Road widening project will improve the road network and is integral to development of a Border region business park. This project will provide important access and linkages to existing and future state highways in the area.

Public input and community outreach efforts are an integral part in developing and constructing the Otay Mesa Road widening project. The County of San Diego will reach out to the public and stakeholders for their involvement and input during the various phases of the project. This particular stretch of Otay Mesa Road is located in the unincorporated area of East Otay Mesa. While there is no formal Community Planning Group, the vast majority of the property owners have formed the East Otay Mesa Property Owners Association. This group meets monthly and is very active in Otay Mesa community interests. County staff will utilize this group for comments and feedback throughout the development processes of the project, from the early planning stages through environmental review and construction. Prior to construction, a public notice will be sent out to the community and traveling public providing pertinent project information. During construction of the Otay Mesa Road widening project, regular updates will be published and a project hotline will be established to give the public a convenient source of information and opportunity to discuss the project with the County directly.

The total cost of the project, including environmental analysis, design, right of way and construction, is estimated at \$28 million. The County of San Diego has committed to contribute \$1,025,000 of local funding in FY 2008/09 -09/10 for the Otay Mesa widening project to begin environmental analysis and design; the total costs of which are estimated at \$4.8 million. Our SAFETEA-LU Reauthorization request for your HPP support is for \$3,775,000 to complete environmental analysis and design.

The County's unique location along the international border creates an opportunity for business development which is important to the regional, state, and national economies. Widening Otay Mesa Road is an important step in that development. We thank you for considering HPP support for this very worthy project. With this letter I am expressing my strongest support for Plaza Boulevard Widening project as a project that is of profound significance locally and regionally.

This is a letter of support in response to your invitation for submitting highway and transit reauthorization projects. With this letter, National City is submitting the Plaza Boulevard Widening and improvement project for the reauthorization program.

Plaza Boulevard is a major east-west artery for the City of National City. It is also a route of regional significance for the South Bay as it connects two major north south interstate routes of 5 and 805 that run through the City. Plaza Boulevard carries much of the crosscity traffic because it runs through the heart of City's Business District, and therefore plays a big role in facilitating much of vehicular and transit as well as commerce related traffic through the City. Recognizing the commercial as well as commute value of Plaza Boulevard, the City of National City has been working towards plans to widen Plaza Boulevard not only to increase capacity and reduce delays and congestion, but also, to help improve operations and increase safety.

The project includes widening of approximately 1.1 miles of Plaza Boulevard to three lanes in each direction from Highland Avenue to the west to Euclid Avenue to the east, including a segment under Interstate 805. The project also provides for improved intersections with exclusive left turn lanes and signalizations at major intersections, as well as medians and landscaping and continuous sidewalks on both directions.

The public hearing was set by the City Council to consider the proposed Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) for the Street Widening Improvements on Plaza Boulevard from Highland Avenue to Euclid Avenue.

The Notice of Availability (NOA) was sent to the local newspaper for publication and to the property owners and occupants in the vicinity of the project site within a 300 feet radius. The notice provides a thirty-days period, as required by Federal Highway Administration (FHWA).

At the public hearing, the City presented the project preliminary design and its impacts to the surrounding properties/facilities and opened for public discussion.

After the adoption of the MND, a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) under National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) was approved by FHWA.

Total estimated construction cost is \$20,000,000. The Federal High Priority Projects Program Funds will support Eighty percent of the total cost at \$16,000,000. The Local TransNet Funds will provide the remaining cost at \$4,000,000.

I would like to express my appreciation for your letter dated April 2, 2009 inviting the City of Chula Vista to submit highway and transit reauthorization projects for the upcoming funding cycle.

I would also like to express my support for Chula Vista's submittal of the application for funding of the Planning, Design and Preparation of Environmental Documents for the Ultimate Improvements at the I-805/ Main Street Interchange. SUBJECT: PHASE TWO: STATE ROUTE 905/ INTERSTATE 805 INTERCHANGE

The San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) supports the inclusion of Phase Two of State Route 905 / Interstate 805 Interchange project in the federal surface transportation authorization bill that will be considered in the 111th Congress.

Funding for Phase Two of the State Route 905 (SR 905) / Interstate 805 (I 805) Interchange projects would allow for the design and construction of the project. The completion of SR 905 will lead to opportunities for increased throughput and cross-border trade. Improvements in velocity and reliability coupled with congestion relief are anticipated to result in increased cross border economic opportunities and safety.

Phase Two of State Route 905 / Interstate 805 Interchange project's total cost is \$22 million. SANDAG is requesting \$12.6 million for this project or 57 percent from the next transportation authorization. The remaining \$5 million or 13 percent of the required 80% of the project total is provided through SAFETEA-LU DEMO funds. The required 20 percent local match will be provided with state and local funding. Likewise, the project is included in SANDAG's Regional Transportation Plan (RTP), the development of which included extensive public participation.







On behalf of the City of Brawley, I respectfully request your support for Brawley's Transit Transfer Station in the Reauthorization of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU). The City is requesting \$1,200,000 to help build the Transit Transfer Station.

The City of Brawley is the third largest City and is located in the Northern part of Imperial County. The City has approximately 26,000 in population. As such, this City is a focal point of government, social services and transportation services which is why it is in great need of a transit transfer station. The fixed route transit system in the Imperial Valley is subsidized by the Imperial Valley Association of Governments (IVAG) and operated by the County of Imperial for the benefit of all residents. Due to the increase in demand over recent years, the transit system is impacted to a point that the City cannot authorize additional stops to serve the new commercial and housing developments in the North and Western areas of the City of Brawley.

There are currently five (5) different routes traversing 35 trips a day on the fixed route system, which serve Brawley. Many of these trips bring passengers into the City for the various facilities and continuation of travel. In addition, residents from Mexicali, which is located 10 miles away with a population of 1.2 million people, shop, dine and use other services at the mall complex, located just south of the Dogwood interchange. Visitors from Mexicali typically enter the US through the Calexico Border crossing and travel up Hwy 111 for 9 miles, then east on Interstate 8 for one mile to the Dogwood Interchange. The El Centro Circulation Element has determined that at city build out, the ADT will reach 69,000 on the future 6-lane bridge interchange. Current traffic already have the bridge operating at a very low level of service, the future retail will only make it worse.

Because of this, funding was awarded to the City to conduct a project study report (PSR) which was completed by Caltrans in 2007. The retail malls just mentioned have contributed local funding for the overpass project of \$5.7 million. In addition, DEMO funds were secured in the amount of \$1,698,000 through the SAFETEA-LU transportation bill. The project is considered a High Priority Project. In total, the city has raised to date \$7,435,264.

The City of El Centro has been working with Caltrans to advance the project and is currently in the process of finalizing a contribution agreement to allow Caltrans to begin the Environmental clearing process, including any necessary public comment periods. The City will be funding the environmental process with local dollars. The next step is to raise money for the design of the project, for which this application is being submitted. We request your upmost consideration to this regional project.
