



PRIVACY ACT CONSENT FORM

The Privacy Act of 1974, (P.L. 93-579), became fully effective on September 27, 1975. The Purpose of the Act is to control the federal government's collection and dissemination of personal information about individual citizens. One of the provisions of the Act prohibits the federal government from revealing any information from any citizen's governmental records without the written permission of the person involved.

The Act also prohibits the disclosure of records to congressional offices acting in their official capacities or on behalf of their constituents, unless the individual to whom the records pertain has expressly consented.
