#### AMENDMENT

#### The amendment is as follows:

Strike all after the resolving clause and insert the following:

That the Secretary of Homeland Security is directed to transmit to the House of Representatives, not later than 14 days after the date of the adoption of this resolution, copies of all documents relating to the Department of Homeland Security Office of Intelligence and Analysis Intelligence Assessment titled, "Rightwing Extremism: Current Economic and Political Climate Fueling Resurgence in Radicalization and Recruitment", including—

(1) all source materials used in the drafting of that Intelligence Assessment;

(2) written material reflecting when the research and writing of that Intelligence Assessment began;

(3) a written description of the clearance process for that Intelligence Assessment and all other Office of Intelligence and Analysis-generated products that were produced for and disseminated to State, local, and tribal law enforcement agencies prior to April 20, 2009;

(4) any written opinions or guidance produced by the Department of Homeland Security Office for Civil Rights and Civil Liberties for the Office of Intelligence and Analysis on production and dissemination of assessments to State, local, and tribal law enforcement prior to April 20, 2009;

(5) any written opinions or guidance, produced by the Department of Homeland Security Chief Privacy Officer for the Office of Intelligence and Analysis, on production and dissemination of assessments to State, local, and tribal law enforcement prior to April 20, 2009;

(6) a written description of the clearance process for that Intelligence Assessment and all other Office of Intelligence and Analysis-generated products produced for and disseminated to State, local, and tribal law enforcement agencies since April 20, 2009.

(7) a written description of what role, if any, the Chief Officer for Civil Rights and Civil Liberties of the Department of Homeland Security has played in the clearance process for Office of Intelligence and Analysis-generated products produced for and disseminated to State, local, and tribal law enforcement since April 20, 2009;

(8) a written description of what role, if any, the Department of Homeland Security Chief Privacy Officer has served in the clearance process for Office of Intelligence and Analysis-generated products produced for and disseminated to State, local, and tribal law enforcement agencies since April 20, 2009;

(9) a written description of what role, if any, the Under Secretary for Intelligence and Analysis of the Department has played in the clearance process for Office of Intelligence and Analysis-generated intelligence products produced for and disseminated to State, local, and tribal law enforcement agencies since April 20, 2009;

(10) the schedule of dates, if any, Office of Intelligence and Analysis employees received or will receive privacy and civil liberties training; and

(11) any other written information on the internal controls on the clearance process for Office of Intelligence and Analysis-generated intelligence products that have been disseminated to State, local, and tribal law enforcement since April 20, 2009.

# PURPOSE AND SUMMARY

The purpose of H. Res. 404 is to provide for submission to the House of Representatives by the Secretary of Homeland Security of copies of all documents relating to the Department of Homeland Security Intelligence Assessment titled, "Rightwing Extremism: Current Economic and Political Climate Fueling Resurgence in Radicalization and Recruitment".

#### BACKGROUND AND NEED FOR LEGISLATION

On April 14, 2009, a copy of the DHS Office of Intelligence and Analysis (I&A) report "Rightwing Extremism: Current Economic and Political Climate Fueling Resurgence in Radicalization and Recruitment," was leaked to the media. The Committee believes that the report, as released, raises significant privacy and civil liberties issues for many Americans—including veterans. The Committee understands that the report was distributed on a limited basis to law enforcement and was never intended to be released publicly. H. Res. 404 is a resolution of inquiry into the drafting and release process for this report and any changes to how DHS drafts, clears, and releases products generated by I&A for distribution to State, local, and tribal law enforcement.

H. Res. 404 is a resolution of inquiry, which, pursuant to Clause 7 of rule XIII of the Rules of the House of Representatives, directs the Committee to act on the resolution within 14 legislative days or a privileged motion to discharge the Committee is in order.

Under the rules and precedents of the House, a resolution of inquiry is one of the methods used by the House to obtain information from the executive branch. According to Volume 7, Chapter 24, Section 8 of Deschler's Procedure, it is a "simple resolution making a direct request or demand of the President or the head of an executive department to furnish the House of Representatives with specific factual information in the possession of the executive branch."

#### HEARINGS

The Committee held no hearings on H. Res. 404.

# COMMITTEE CONSIDERATION

The Committee on Homeland Security considered H. Res. 404 on May 19, 2009, and ordered the measure reported to the House with a favorable recommendation, as amended, by voice vote.

The Committee adopted H. Res. 404, as amended, by voice vote. The following amendment was offered:

An Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute offered by Mr. Thompson (#1); was AGREED TO by voice vote.

# COMMITTEE VOTES

Clause 3(b) of rule XIII of the Rules of the House of Representatives requires the Committee to list the recorded votes on the motion to report legislation and amendments thereto.

No recorded votes were requested during consideration of H. Res. 404.

# COMMITTEE OVERSIGHT FINDINGS

Pursuant to clause 3(c)(1) of rule XIII of the Rules of the House of Representatives, the Committee has held oversight hearings and made findings that are reflected in this report.

Clause 3(c)(2) of rule XIII of the Rules of the House of Representatives does not apply, as H. Res. 404 does not provide new budgetary authority or increased tax expenditures.

#### STATEMENT OF GENERAL PERFORMANCE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Clause 3(c)(4) of rule XIII of the Rules of the House of Representatives does not apply, as H. Res. 404 does not authorize funding.

# CONGRESSIONAL EARMARKS, LIMITED TAX BENEFITS, AND LIMITED TARIFF BENEFITS

In compliance with rule XXI of the Rules of the House of Representatives, this bill, as reported, contains no congressional earmarks, limited tax benefits, or limited tariff benefits as defined in clause 9(d), 9(e), or 9(f) of the rule XXI.

#### FEDERAL MANDATES STATEMENT

H. Res. 404 provides no Federal mandates.

This provision directs the Secretary of Homeland Security to transmit to the House of Representatives, copies of all documents relating to the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Intelligence Assessment titled, "Rightwing Extremism: Current Economic and Political Climate Fueling Resurgence in Radicalization and Recruitment" (Assessment) including all information on source material; timelines for the research and writing of this Assessment; the clearance process for the issuance of this Assessment and other products generated by the DHS Office of Intelligence and Analysis for dissemination to State, local, and tribal law enforcement prior to April 20, 2009; written opinions or guidance provided by the DHS Office of Intelligence and Analysis for dissemination to State, local, and tribal law enforcement prior to April 20, 2009; written opinions or guidance provided by the DHS Chief Privacy Officer for the issuance of this Assessment and other products generated by the

DHS Office of Intelligence and Analysis for dissemination to State, local, and tribal law enforcement prior to April 20, 2009; the clearance process involved in issuance of products generated by the DHS Office of Intelligence and Analysis for dissemination to State, local, and tribal law enforcement since April 20, 2009; the written description of what role the Chief Officer for Civil Rights and Civil Liberties plays in the clearance process for Office of Intelligence and Analysis-generated products for dissemination to State, local, and tribal law enforcement since April 20, 2009; the written description of the role the DHS Chief Privacy Officer plays in the clearance process for Office of Intelligence and Analysis-generated products for dissemination to State, local, and tribal law enforcement since April 20, 2009; written description of the role the DHS Under Secretary for Intelligence and Analysis plays in the clearance process for Office of Intelligence and Analysis-generated products produced for and disseminated to State, local, and tribal law enforcement agencies since April 20, 2009; the schedule of dates that employees of the Office of Intelligence and Analysis have received or will receive privacy and civil liberties training; and other written information on the internal controls and clearance process for DHS Office of Intelligence and Analysis-generated products that have been disseminated to State, local, and tribal law enforcement since April 20, 2009.

CHANGES IN EXISTING LAW MADE BY THE BILL, AS REPORTED

H. Res. 404 makes no changes to existing law.

Dear Secretary Napolitano:

I am writing regarding an April 2009 report generated by the Department's Office of Intelligence and Analysis (I&A) entitled, "Rightwing Extremism: Current Economic and Political Climate Fueling Resurgence in Radicalization and Recruitment". This report appears to raise significant issues involving the privacy and civil liberties of many Americans – including war veterans.

As I am certain you agree, freedom of association and freedom of speech are guaranteed to all Americans — whether a person's beliefs, whatever their political orientation, are "extremist" or not. What the U.S. Constitution does not protect is violent action based on those beliefs. I&A's intelligence mission, therefore, is properly directed to helping State, local and tribal law enforcement prevent terrorism and other violent crimes. Unfortunately, this report appears to have blurred the line between violent belief, which is Constitutionally protected, and violent action, which is not. I am disappointed and surprised that the Department would allow this report to be disseminated to its State, local and tribal partners in its present form.

As you know, the Committee's Subcommittee on Intelligence, Information Sharing & Terrorism Risk Assessment recently held a hearing on fusion centers and associated privacy and civil liberties issues. Participants engaged in a rigorous discussion of the facts and myths about how those centers conduct themselves, how they share information about terrorism and other crimes, and the extent to which Constitutional safeguards are built into their daily work. Our Members came away from the hearing confident that the Department's Office of Civil Rights and Civil Liberties has successfully partnered with I&A to develop and deploy an increasingly effective privacy and civil liberties training program at fusion centers. Given this positive collaboration, I am dumbfounded that I&A released this report.

I am particularly struck by the report's conclusion which states that I&A "will be working with its state and local partners over the next several months to ascertain with greater regional specificity the rise in rightwing extremist activity in the United States, with a particular emphasis on the political, economic, and social factors that drive rightwing extremist radicalization." [emphasis added]. I would like more information about what types of activities I&A intends to undertake in the next few months in this regard.

Additionally, please provide a written description of your clearance process for I&A-generated intelligence products that are to be disseminated to State, local, and tribal law enforcement. In general terms, I would like information on what role, if any, the Chief Privacy Officer and the Officer for Civil Rights and Civil Liberties play in the preparation and clearance process for such products. I also would like information on what role, if any, they played with respect to this specific report.

# Dear Chairman Thompson:

Thank you for your letter regarding the Department of Homeland Security's recent risk assessment entitled, "Rightwing Extremism: Current Economic and Political Climate Fueling Resurgence in Radicalization and Recruitment." This intelligence product was released earlier this month to our State, local and tribal partners. I appreciate the questions you raised about the assessment, and I am happy to respond.

As you know, the Department of Homeland Security was created in the aftermath of the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks. Preventing future attacks on the homeland, whether by foreign or homegrown terrorists, remains the Department's number one priority. To accomplish this mission, the Department must share accurate, actionable, and timely threat-related information with our State, local and tribal partners so they can take appropriate action to protect their communities.

The assessment at issue was produced by the Office of Intelligence and Analysis (I&A) in the regular course of the Department's information sharing work. Such assessments provide a vital service to state, local, and tribal authorities who often rely on DHS for intelligence and analytical support.

I fully appreciate the concerns raised by you and others about this particular assessment. I&A, as part of its analysis work, does not focus on individuals or groups solely based on their First Amendment-protected associations, beliefs, or speech. Instead, I&A targets criminal behavior that poses a threat to the nation.

Regarding your specific concerns, it's clear that the message in the assessment could have been made more directly and succinctly, and that there was a breakdown in the clearance process before its distribution. I want you to know that we have initiated new controls to ensure that there is more internal review of these products. The level of consultation between I&A and the Office of Civil Rights and Civil Liberties was inadequate in this process. I am particularly concerned that issues raised by the Office of Civil Rights and Civil Liberties were not resolved prior to the assessment's release. That

will not happen in the future.

With this reinvigorated privacy and civil liberties process in place, the Department will continue to assess the risks posed by individuals and groups who engage in criminal or violent criminal activity that endangers the homeland, regardless of their ideology.

Those threats are real. The recent addition of the first American to the FBI's list of Most Wanted Terrorists for his role in a string of corporate bombings in California; the arrests in 2007 of citizens who were plotting an attack on Fort Dix; the arrest of a white supremacist in 2002 who had stockpiled enough sodium cyanide in his east Texas home to kill everyone inside a 30,000 square-foot building; and the Oklahoma City bombing are just a few examples of the dangers we face. The Department has a responsibility to prevent these types of attacks. It also has a responsibility to inform our state, local and tribal partners about illegal activity that may be a precursor to terrorism and other violent crime.

The April I&A assessment was intended to provide situational awareness of just these kinds of threats. In response to your request, I have directed my staff to provide information to the Committee about I&A's production and dissemination process, the lack of internal review, and the steps I will be taking to fix the problem.

Thank you again for sharing your concerns with me. I look forward to a successful and productive partnership with the Committee on Homeland Security, and I encourage you to call me if you have any additional concerns.

#### REPUBLICAN MEMBER VIEWS

Committee Report to Accompany H. Res. 404, a Resolution of Inquiry "Directing the Secretary of Homeland Security to transmit to the House of Representatives, not later than 14 days after the date of the adoption of this resolution, copies of documents relating to the Department of Homeland Security Intelligence Assessment titled, 'Rightwing Extremism: Current Economic and Political Climate Fueling Resurgence in Radicalization and Recruitment'."

#### INTRODUCTION

The Republican Members of the Committee on Homeland Security ("Committee") are pleased that the Committee reported favorably (as amended) to the full House H. Res. 404, the Resolution of Inquiry. We appreciate this nearly unprecedented display of cooperation on a Resolution of Inquiry, and we commend the Majority for their support.

#### BACKGROUND

On April 14, 2009, media reports described an "assessment" issued by the Department of Homeland Security entitled, "Rightwing Extremism: Current Economic and Political Climate Fueling Resurgence in Radicalization and Recruitment." The release of this report raised serious concerns across the country about its depiction of military veterans as recruits for terrorists, as well as its overly broad characterizations of those who oppose gun control, free trade agreements, abortion, and same-sex marriage.

It is critical the Committee conduct a bipartisan inquiry into the process within the Department of Homeland Security that led to the development and release of the report, as well as what steps have been taken to ensure a similar intra-departmental breakdown does not occur again. Therefore, Committee Republicans, joined by the House Republican Leadership, introduced the Resolution of Inquiry because of the seriousness of the issue and the need for answers.

The Chairman's Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute reflects and builds on the provisions included in H. Res. 404. According to a parliamentary expert at the Congressional Research Service, it is "nearly unprecedented" that a resolution of inquiry is amended during the markup process. Rather, most such resolutions are reported with a negative recommendation by the Majority—regardless of which party is in power.

The Chairman's Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute recognizes the merits of H. Res. 404 and aims to address the serious

issues raised by the Department's "Rightwing Extremism" report. The Resolution of Inquiry, as amended, is comprehensive and will allow the committee to conduct bipartisan oversight on this issue. As the Chairman stated during the markup, the resolution requires that the Secretary transmit all written documents, including emails, related to the production and dissemination of this report. The Resolution, as amended, further requires that the Secretary transmit these documents to the House of Representatives within 14 days after the date the resolution is adopted.

We believe that this is the only way to fully explore how this report was created and what new procedures are in place to ensure that a similar breakdown does not happen again. We, therefore, thank the Majority for their bipartisan support in favorably reporting this critical resolution, and we look forward to working with the Majority to ensure that this resolution is considered by the full

House and the Department fully complies with its provisions.
