## Retirement Benefits:

- You must be at least 61 years and 9 months old to apply for retirement benefits
- You should apply for benefits no more than four (4) months before the date you want your benefits to start
- If you are not getting Social Security and you are not ready to retire, you should still sign up for Medicare four (4) months before your 65<sup>th</sup> birthday

## Supplemental Security Income (SSI):

- SSI program pays benefits to disabled adults and children who have limited income and resources
- SSI benefits are also payable to people 65 and older without disabilities who meet the financial limits

Social Security Disability (SSDI):

- SSDI pays benefits to you and certain family members if you worked long enough and paid Social Security taxes
- Your adult child may also qualify for benefits on your earnings record if he or she has a disability that started before the age of 22.

## Survivor Benefits:

- Social Security Survivor's benefits can be paid to:
  - o A widow or widower full benefits at full retirement age, or reduced benefits as early as age 60
  - o A disabled widow or widower as early as age 50
  - O A widow or widower at any age if he or she takes care of the deceased's child who is under age 16 or disabled and receiving Social Security benefits
  - O Unmarried children under 18 or up to age 19 if they are attending high school full time. Under certain circumstances, benefits can be paid to stepchildren, grandchildren or adopted children
  - Children at any age who were disabled before the age of 22 and remain disabled
  - O Dependent parents age 62 or older
  - o If you are divorced, you may still qualify for survivors benefits

#### Services:

- **Aged, Blind, Disabled** Medicaid is available to persons who are aged, blind, or disabled. There are income and asset limits. If the income is over the income limit, persons may incur medical expenses that equal or exceed income and still qualify for the program. Contact the local DHS in your area to apply for this program
- Medicare Savings Program (MSP) pays for certain Medicare costs. There is an asset limit. The income amount determines what is covered. The Michigan Department of Community Health (MDCH) may help pay for the following, depending on income:
  - o Medicare premiums
  - Medicare coinsurance
  - Medicare deductible

# For the following programs contact the DHS numbers listed above

**LIHEAP** is federal money given to each state to assist low-income families with energy costs. In Michigan, the LIHEAP block grant is used for the following programs:

- o Home Heating Credit
- o State Emergency Relief (SER)
- o Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP)

For more information on LIHEAP, call the toll-free DHS Energy Hotline at 1-800-292-5650 between 8:00 a.m. and 4:45 p.m. Monday through Friday.

The Home Heating Credit is available to all low-income households. The Michigan Department of Treasury determines eligibility and makes the payments. You do not need to file a state income tax return to receive the Home Heating Credit. You may apply for the Home Heating Credit only. Eligibility is based on income, number of exemptions and household heating costs.

Application forms are available from the Department of the Treasury, local Department of Human Services offices and anywhere Michigan tax return forms are available. Forms are automatically mailed to households who received a credit last year. Applications are available from mid to late January and may be made through September 30 of each year.

Request a <u>Home Heating Credit Claim Form</u> (MI-1040CR-7) from the list of forms on the Michigan Department of Treasury website (http://www.michigan.gov/treasury/) or for more information go to the Energy Assistance Programs.

The State Emergency Relief (SER) program provides immediate help to individuals and families facing conditions of extreme hardship or for emergencies that threaten health and safety. Through a combination of direct financial assistance and contracts with a network of non-profit organizations such as the Salvation Army and local Community Action Organizations, SER helps low-income households meet emergency needs such as:

- Heat & Utilities
- o Home Repairs
- o Relocation Assistance
- Home Ownership Services
- o Burial

The SER program is primarily designed to maintain low-income households who are normally able to meet their needs but occasionally need help when unexpected emergency situations arise. The SER program is not an appropriate solution to ongoing or chronic financial difficulties.

Michigan's Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) is a federally funded, low-income residential energy conservation program. The program provides free home energy conservation services to low-income Michigan homeowners and renters. These services reduce energy use and lower utility bills, thus creating

more self-sufficient households. Services are typically administered by local Community Action Agencies and include:

- Wall Insulation
- o Attic Insulation and Ventilation
- Foundation Insulation
- o Air Leakage Reduction
- Smoke Detectors
- o Dryer Venting

The Food Assistance Program supplements the food purchasing power of low-income individuals and families. The Department of Human Services determines eligibility for food assistance. *Please see the information below to apply.* 

Michigan's Coordinated Access to Food for the Elderly

(MiCAFE) assists adults 60 and older to make ends meet by applying for help to pay their bills. The MiCAFE program gets older people of modest means the things they need most — money to buy food, money to cover medical expenses, and money to pay bills. The Bridge Card, the Medicare Savings Program, Utility Assistance and In-Home Services are key services to aid older adults in covering their basic needs and living independently at home. MiCAFE and its team of volunteers will help you, or someone you care about, apply for services in a comfortable, senior-friendly setting near your home.

## Extra Help (from "Medicare & You" 2010)

Extra Help Paying for Medicare Prescription Drug Coverage (Part D). You may qualify for Extra Help, also called the low-income subsidy (LIS) from Medicare to pay prescription drug costs if your yearly income and resources are below the following limits in 2009:

- Single Person income less than \$16,245 and resources less than \$12,510
- Married person living with a spouse and no other dependents income less than \$21,855 and resources less than \$25,010

You automatically qualify for Extra help if you have Medicare and meet one of the following conditions:

- You have full Medicaid coverage
- You get help from your state Medicare program paying your Part B premiums (belong to a Medicare Savings Program)
- You get Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits

Medicare will mail you a purple letter (keep this letter for your records) to let you know that you automatically qualify for Extra Help.

If you did not automatically qualify for Extra Help, you can apply by:
