The U.S.-China Economic and Security Review Commission will conduct a public hearing on Thursday, September 6, 2007 on "China's Impact on the North Carolina Economy: Winners and Losers." The hearing will be held in Conference Room 204, The Kenan Conference Center, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, located at Skipper Bowles Road, Chapel Hill, North Carolina.
