The U.S.-China Economic and Security Review Commission will conduct a public hearing on Thursday, April 8, 2010 on “China’s Green Energy and Environmental Policies.” **The hearing will begin at 9:00 am in Room 562 of the Dirksen Senate Office Building**, located at First Street and Constitution Avenue, NE, Washington DC, 20510.

The April 8 hearing will examine China’s domestic and international clean energy policies and the potential for cooperation between the United States and China on climate change and clean energy technologies.
