Within its new mission, OD identifies opportunities to maximize and streamline processes that result in the elimination of inefficient or redundant efforts to serve Americans with disabilities. Efforts to fulfill OD's mission are organized around three themes: Improve Access to Community Living Services and Supports, Integrate Health Services and Social Supports, and Provide Strategic Support on Disability Matters.
