EXPLANATION OF H.R. H.R. 6602, TO MAKE REVISIONS IN TITLE 36, UNITED STATES CODE, AS NECESSARY TO KEEP THE TITLE CURRENT AND MAKE TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS

PURPOSE AND SUMMARY

H.R. 6602 would make revisions in title 36, United States Code, as necessary to keep the title current and make technical corrections and improvements.

BACKGROUND AND NEED FOR LEGISLATION

H.R. 6602 makes revisions in title 36, United States Code, as necessary to keep the title current and make technical corrections and improvements. The bill was prepared by the Office of the Law Revision Counsel of the House of Representatives as part of its responsibility under section 205(c) of House Resolution No. 988, 93d Congress, as enacted into law by Public Law 93–554 (2 U.S.C. 285b), to prepare and submit periodically to the Committee on the Judiciary proposed bills to maintain titles of the United States Code that have been enacted into positive law.

SECTION-BY-SECTION ANALYSIS

SECTION 1—TABLE OF CONTENTS

Section 1 of the bill provides a table of contents for the Act.

SECTION 2—PURPOSE

Section 2 of the bill provides that the purpose is to make revisions in title 36, United States Code, as necessary to keep the title current and make technical corrections and improvements.

SECTION 3—TECHNICAL AMENDMENTS

Section 3(a)(1) of the bill amends title 36, United States Code, by striking the existing abbreviated table of contents of the title and inserting a more comprehensive titlewide table of contents.

Section 3(a)(2) of the bill amends title 36, United States Code, by striking the existing tables of contents of the subtitles, which are rendered unnecessary by the comprehensive titlewide table of contents enacted by section 3(a)(1).

Section 3(b) of the bill amends title 36, United States Code, by updating the format of the chapter headings of reserved chapters.

Section 3(c) of the bill amends title 36, United States Code, by making other necessary technical corrections.
