Application for Nomination to the United States Armed Services Academies

**** All documentation must be sent in the SAME package to my Rock Hill office****

1. **APPLICATION FORM** – must be completed and signed by applicant. This must be typed or neatly printed. Formal candidacy can only be established upon the receipt of a completed application by the Rock Hill District Office. It is the responsibility of each applicant to initiate a pre-candidate file at each academy to which they are seeking a nomination.

2. **PERSONAL RECOMMENDATION FORMS** – candidates must submit three (3) Personal Recommendation forms. One must be completed by a counselor or principal. The other 2 may be from teachers, religious leaders (i.e. priests, rabbis, and ministers), coaches, or community leaders. Candidates may have 3 letters of recommendation as well. Letters in excess of this number will not be reviewed. All references should be from non-family members.

3. **ACADEMIC TRANSCRIPT** – The official transcript must be in a sealed envelope with a signature across the seal. If a candidate has already graduated from high school, in addition to a transcript, information outlining the candidates academic and/or employment activities since graduation should also be included.

4. **CURRENT PHOTOGRAPH** – please submit a wallet size photo with name and hometown written on the back.

5. **STANDARDIZED TEST RESULTS** – Please include ACT and/or SAT scores in the application packet. Scores that appear on a sealed transcript or in a sealed envelope from a guidance counselor will be accepted. The following codes may be used for scores to be sent directly to my office: SAT Code – 5682, ACT Code – 7665

6. **Personal Statement**– Please explain why you want to attend a United States Service Academy in 500 words or less.

NOTE: Qualifying candidates will be required to attend an interview session either in November or December 2012. Dates, times and location will be determined at a later date.
