What is the Congressional Student Art Competition?

Since 1993, Congressman Xavier Becerra has held an annual Student Art Competition open to all high school students who reside in the 31st Congressional District. Each spring, a nation-wide high school arts competition is sponsored by the Members of the U.S. House of Representatives. The Congressional Student Art Competition is an opportunity to recognize and encourage the artistic talent in the nation, as well as in each congressional district.

Art Competition Rules & Guidelines

All art entries must meet the following criteria:

- Artwork must be two-dimensional
- Be no larger than 28 inches wide by 28 inches tall by 4 inches thick
- Not weigh more than 15 pounds
- Be original in concept, design and execution and may not violate any U.S. copyright laws. Any
 entry that has been copied from an existing photo (Not the student's own), painting, graphic,
 advertisement, or any other work produced by another person is a violation of the competition
 rules and will not be accepted
- Work entered must be in the original medium (Not a scanned reproduction of a painting or drawing)

Entries must be in one of the following mediums:

- Paintings: oil, acrylics, watercolor, etc.
- Drawings: pastels, colored pencil, pencil, charcoal, ink, markers
- Collage: must be two dimensional
- Prints: lithographs, silkscreen, block prints
- Mixed Media: use of more than two mediums such as pencil, ink, watercolor, etc.
- Computer-generated art
- Photography

Each work of art entered into the competition is judged by a panel of judges for the opportunity to be displayed in the U.S. Capitol for one year. Second and third place winners will also be recognized.

The first place winner of the competition receives:

- An all expense paid trip to Washington D.C. to attend the national ceremony
- Artwork is displayed in the U.S. Capitol for one year
