# VA Extends Verification Term for Veteran Entrepreneurs Two Years to Help Efficiency, Accountability

WASHINGTON -- The Department of Veterans Affairs is doubling the amount of time before the owners of service-disabled, Veteran-owned small businesses (SDVOSB) and Veteran-owned small businesses (VOSB) must re-verify with VA that they are, in fact, owned and operated by qualified Veterans and other legal requirements.

"The community of Veteran-owned businesses and businesses owned by service-disabled Veterans is a vital partner with VA and the federal government," said Secretary of Veterans Affairs Eric K. Shinseki. "To ensure we have improved our verification policies and processes, I have directed that VA simplify the verification process immediately and move from an annual to a biennial re-verification – every two years."

The interim final rule, which took effect June 27, will benefit thousands of small businesses by reducing the uncertainty and administrative burden associated with a yearly verification cycle. Public comments on this interim final rule may be submitted within the next 60 days.

By increasing the verification period to two years, SDVOSBs and VOSBs will be able to plan and operate their companies more efficiently and effectively instead of working within the current 12-month business cycle. Under this interim final rule, businesses at the end of their two-year verification period would be required to be re-verified through VA's Center for Veterans Enterprise (CVE).

In 2011, VA awarded \$3.2 billion in contracts to VOSBs and SDVOSBs. To participate in VA's Veterans First program, a Veteran-owned and controlled small business must be verified as an eligible firm by initiating and completing the application process with CVE through the web-based Vendor Information Pages database. Businesses removed from the VIP database that were verified from June 2010 to December 2010 will have their remaining months added to coincide with their one year extension via the interim change.

These designated businesses will be required to re-verify within 120 days of their expiration date. All future applications for re-verification will be required to submit a complete set of new documentation with each application.

# **SAM implementation**What is SAM?

The System for Award Management (SAM) is combining eight federal procurement systems and the Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance into one new system.

The General Services Administration (GSA) is moving the implementation date of the System for Award Management (SAM) from May 29, 2012 to the end of July 2012. The additional sixty days will allow federal agencies to continue preparing their staff, give agencies and commercial system providers even more time to test their data transfer connections, and will ensure SAM contains the critical, documented capabilities users need from the system.

This first phase of SAM will include the capabilities of Central Contractor Registration (CCR)/Federal Agency Registration (FedReg), Online Representations and Certifications Application (ORCA), and the Excluded Parties List System (EPLS). In preparation for the launch, GSA conducted extensive testing internally and in coordination with federal agencies using the data from these systems in their own contracting, grants, finance, and other departments. The testing was very valuable and will focus the efforts of the next sixty days.

SAM will reduce the burden on those seeking to do business with the government. Vendors will be able to log into one system to manage their entity information in one record, with one expiration date, through one streamlined business process. Federal agencies will be able to look in one place for entity pre-award information. Everyone will have fewer passwords to remember and see the benefits of data reuse as information is entered into SAM once and reused throughout the system.

# **Description**

The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, Center for Substance Abuse Treatment is accepting applications for fiscal year (FY) 2012 Targeted Capacity Expansion Program: Substance Abuse Treatment for Racial/Ethnic Minority Populations at High-Risk for HIV/AIDS grants. The purpose of this program is to facilitate the development and expansion of culturally competent and effective community-based treatment systems for substance use and co-occurring substance use and mental disorders within racial and ethnic minority communities in States with the highest HIV prevalence rates (at or above 270 per 100,000). The expected outcomes for the program include reducing the impact of behavioral health problems, reducing HIV risk and incidence, and increasing access to treatment for individuals with coexisting behavioral health, HIV, and Hepatitis conditions. This program will ensure that individuals who are at high risk for or have a substance use or co-occurring substance use and mental disorder and who are most at-risk for or are living with HIV/AIDS have access to and receive appropriate behavioral health services. Grant funds must be used to serve people diagnosed with a substance use disorder as their primary condition. This grant program is part of the Congressional Minority AIDS Initiative, which was developed to improve HIV-related health outcomes for racial and ethnic minority communities disproportionately affected by HIV/AIDS and to reduce HIV-related health disparities. The program also supports the goals of the National HIV/AIDS Strategy. Three key findings from National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) Research Report indicate that the interactions of drug abuse and HIV/AIDS extend far beyond injection drug use. First, drug abuse impairs judgment and good decision making, leaving people more prone to engage in HIV risk behaviors, including risky sexual behavior and non-adherence to HIV treatment. Key goals of the NHAS include: 1) reducing the number of people who become infected with HIV, 2) increasing access to care and optimizing health outcomes for people living with HIV, and 3) reducing HIV-related health disparities (p. vii, National HIV AIDS Strategy, Office of National AIDS Policy, the White House, Washington, DC, 2010). In support of the NHAS, the goals of the Minority AIDS Initiative and SAMHSA's mission to reduce the impact of substance abuse and mental illness on America's communities, applicants eligible to apply for this grant opportunity are limited to domestic public and private nonprofit, community-based organizations (CBOs) and Federally recognized Tribes and tribal organizations, in States and Territories with HIV prevalence rates of 270/100,000 or higher.1 The following 22 States and Territories meet this criterion: District of Columbia, New York, U.S. Virgin Islands, Florida, Puerto Rico, Maryland, New Jersey, Georgia, Louisiana, Delaware, South Carolina, Connecticut, California, Mississippi, Nevada, Texas, Virginia, North Carolina, Illinois, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, and Alabama. Using data from the local health department, all applicants must provide evidence of the need for the provision of substance use and/or co-occurring substance use and mental disorders treatment in their community, that the population(s) of focus are highly impacted by HIV/AIDS, and that they will primarily serve racial and ethnic minority populations, in Section A of the Project Narrative. This program will also align with goals of the HHS Action Plan for the Prevention, Care & Treatment of Viral Hepatitis2 related to addressing the need for reducing viral hepatitis related to drug use behavior. HIV-infected persons, MSM, and intravenous drug users (IDUs) are disproportionately affected by viral hepatitis and related adverse health conditions. Grantees will be required to integrate efforts to prevent new viral hepatitis infections, identify hepatitis infected persons, and to provide better linkages and referrals to care and treatment. Grantees should try to identify persons infected with viral hepatitis early in the course of their disease. All clients who are considered to be at risk for viral hepatitis (B and C) as specified by CDC recommendations for hepatitis B (CDC, 2008)3 and hepatitis C (CDC, 1998)4 should be tested for hepatitis (B and C). All clients testing positive for viral hepatitis (B or C) should be referred for treatment. SAMHSA is particularly interested in

providing services to focus on young MSM. According to recent CDC data5, young MSM are particularly affected by HIV, representing one quarter of all new HIV infections. You are not required to focus on young MSM. However, if young MSM is your sole population of focus, you will be able to earn up to 5 points in Section B of the Project Narrative. In this section, applicants who propose to provide services to young MSM are asked to describe their experience and effectiveness in serving this population. (See Section V-I of the RFA, Priority Population-Young MSM). Applicants must propose to provide substance use and/or cooccurring substance use and mental disorders treatment and recovery support services to racial and ethnic minorities in one or more of the following populations at high risk for HIV or living with HIV: Young men who have sex with men (MSM) (ages 18-29); Adult heterosexual women and men; and Men who have sex with men (MSM) (ages 30 and older). In addition to providing substance use and/or co-occurring substance use and mental disorders treatment and recovery support services, HIV/AIDS testing and case management services, grantees are expected to enhance infrastructure and capacity to improve the community's response to HIV/AIDS by increasing access to care and services for racial and ethnic minorities at high risk for or living with HIV/AIDS. Expected outcomes for individuals with substance use and/or co-occurring substance use and mental disorders include: reduced HIV transmission; increased number of people receiving treatment for substance use and/or co-occurring substance use and mental disorders; increased number of people who, post-treatment, receive recovery support services; increased number of people who know their HIV status; and increased number of HIV positive people who are case-managed and referred to primary HIV care for antiretroviral therapy (ART) and other services necessary for optimizing health outcomes; increased number of people screened for viral hepatitis (B and C); increased number of people who know their hepatitis status; and increased number of people positive for viral hepatitis (B and C) who are referred to primary care. The TCE-Substance Abuse Treatment for High-Risk Populations program addresses a number of SAMHSA's Strategic Initiatives including Prevention of Substance Abuse and Mental Health Illness, Recovery Support, and Health Reform. The TCE-HIV program is one of SAMHSA's services grant programs. SAMHSA intends that its services grants result in the delivery of services as soon as possible after the award. However, one additional person may be designated as Co-Principal Investigator if developing and operating the REU Site would involve such shared responsibility. Other anticipated research supervisors should be listed as Non-Co-PI Senior Personnel. After a proposal is awarded, some NSF units may allow the addition of more Co-PIs if an exceptional case can be made for why the management of the REU Site must be distributed.



# The Small Business Innovative Research Program - SBIR Program

The Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) program is a highly competitive program that encourages domestic small businesses to engage in Federal Research/Research and Development (R/R&D) that has the potential for commercialization. Through a competitive awards-based program, SBIR enables small businesses to explore their technological potential and provides the incentive to profit from its commercialization. By including qualified small businesses in the nation's R&D arena, high-tech innovation is stimulated and the United States gains entrepreneurial spirit as it meets its specific research and development needs.

# **SBIR Mission and Program Goals**

The mission of the SBIR program is to support scientific excellence and technological innovation through the investment of Federal research funds in critical American priorities to build a strong national economy.

The program's goals are four-fold:

- Stimulate technological innovation
- Meet Federal research and development needs.
- Foster and encourage participation in innovation and entrepreneurship by socially and economically disadvantaged persons.
- Increase private-sector commercialization of innovations derived from Federal research and development funding.

#### **SBIR-Participating Agencies**

Each year, Federal agencies with extramural research and development (R&D) budgets that exceed \$100 million are required to allocate 2.5 percent of their R&D budget to these programs. Currently, eleven Federal agencies participate in the program:

- Department of Agriculture
- Department of Commerce <u>National Institute of Standards and</u> Technology

- Department of Commerce <u>National Oceanic and Atmospheric</u> <u>Administration</u>
- Department of Defense
- Department of Education
- Department of Energy
- Department of Health and Human Services
- Department of Homeland Security
- Department of Transportation
- Environmental Protection Agency
- National Aeronautics and Space Administration
- National Science Foundation

Each agency administers its own individual program within guidelines established by Congress. These agencies designate R&D topics in their solicitations and accept proposals from small businesses. Awards are made on a competitive basis after proposal evaluation.

# **Three-Phase Program**

The SBIR Program is structured in three phases:

*Phase I.* The objective of Phase I is to establish the technical merit, feasibility, and commercial potential of the proposed R/R&D efforts and to determine the quality of performance of the small business awardee organization prior to providing further Federal support in Phase II. SBIR Phase I awards normally do not exceed \$150,000 total costs for 6 months.

Phase II. The objective of Phase II is to continue the R/R&D efforts initiated in Phase I. Funding is based on the results achieved in Phase I and the scientific and technical merit and commercial potential of the project proposed in Phase II. Only Phase I awardees are eligible for a Phase II award. SBIR Phase II awards normally do not exceed \$1,000,000 total costs for 2 years.

*Phase III.* The objective of Phase III, where appropriate, is for the small business to pursue commercialization objectives resulting from the Phase I/II R/R&D activities. The SBIR program does not fund Phase III. Some Federal agencies, Phase III may involve follow-on non-SBIR funded R&D or production contracts for products, processes or services intended for use by the U.S. Government.
