8 (a) In General.—Notwithstanding any other prov

9 sion of law, the total amount which is paid or reimbursed

1	by an agency under subchapter 1 and 11 of chapter 57
2	of title 5, United States Code, may not—
3	(1) for each of fiscal years 2013 and 2014, ex-
4	ceed 50 percent of the total amount so paid or reim-
5	bursed by such agency for fiscal year 2012; and
6	(2) for fiscal year 2015, exceed 75 percent of
7	the total amount so paid or reimbursed by such
8	agency for fiscal year 2012.
9	(b) Report.—Not later than 30 days after the begin-
10	ning of each of fiscal years 2014 through 2016, the head
11	of each agency shall submit a report to the Committee
12	on Oversight and Government Reform in the House of
13	Representatives and the Committee on Homeland Security
14	and Governmental Affairs of the Senate with respect to
15	the total travel expenses paid or reimbursed under such
16	subchapters by such agency during the preceding fiscal
17	year. Such report shall include a list of dates, locations,
18	and costs of such travel.
19	(c) Definition.—For purposes of this section, the
20	term "agency" has the meaning given that term under
21	section 5701(1) of title 5, United States Code, but does
22	not include the following:
23	(1) The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms
24	and Explosives.
