Abortion: Members passed, 251-172, a bill to expand or reaffirm a ban on federal abortion funding in the 2010 health law. Foes said the prohibition already is in the law. Known as the Hyde Amendment, the ban outlaws taxpayer funding of abortions except in cases of rape or incest or when the procedure is necessary to save the mother's life. A yes vote was to pass HR 358.

U.S.-Colombia Free Trade: Members passed, 262-167, a bill to implement a U.S.-Colombia free-trade agreement that would phase out or immediately remove nearly all Colombian tariffs on U.S. consumer-goods, industrial and farm exports. A yes vote was to send HR 3078 to the Senate.

U.S.-South Korea Free Trade: Members passed, 278-151, a bill approving free trade between the U.S. and South Korea. A yes vote was to send the Senate what would be the largest U.S. trade pact since the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) in 1994. (HR 3080)

U.S.-Panama Free Trade: Members passed, 300-129, a bill to launch a trade pact between the U.S. and Panama. A yes vote was to send the Senate an agreement that would immediately remove Panamanian tariffs from nearly 90 percent of U.S. industrial and consumer-goods exports. (HR 3079)
