Vergennes Senior Housing



What:

The creation of 25 affordable homes for seniors with a wide range of incomes through the construction of a 3-story, 25,244 square foot building. Eight apartments will receive HUD rental assistance so that residents will pay about 30% of their income for rent. Rents for the remaining apartments are projected to range from \$565 to \$865, including heat, hot water and electricity. Vergennes Senior Housing will offer 20 onebedroom and 5 two-bedroom apartments. Three apartments are fully handicap accessible and the remaining units are adaptable.

Notable features include:

- Super-insulation package;
- Rooftop solar array to preheat hot water for heat and domestic use:
- Wood pellet boilers (propane back-up);
- Energy Star lighting and appliances;
- Activity space for residents and the Vergennes Senior Housing Association:
- Amenities including a wrap-around porch, community gardens, lobby with fireplace, community room, nurse room, activity space and elevator.

Where:

Vergennes Senior Housing is located on Armory Lane adjacent to a shopping center and within walking distance to the downtown.

Who:

The Addison County Community Trust and Housing Vermont partnered to develop this innovative project. Wiemann-Lamphere

TOTAL \$6,208,696 Architects designed the building and the Bread Loaf Corporation is the construction manager.

How:

Funding totaling about \$6.2 million from numerous sources was raised to cover the total development costs. Senator Bernie Sanders secured HUD Economic Development Initiative funds. People's United Bank is providing both a tax credit equity investment of \$2,751,250 and construction financing. Other sources include HUD; the Vermont Housing and Conservation Board; Vermont Housing Finance Agency; Vermont Department of Economic, Housing and Community Development; City of Vergennes; and the Vermont Energy Investment Corporation.
