 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Utah Laboratory of

1	SEC. 2. UTAH ADMINISTRATION OF FEDERAL EDUCATION,						
2	TRANSPORTATION, AND MEDICAID PRO-

4	(a) Transfer of Administration.—The Secretary						
5	of Education, the Secretary of Transportation, and the						
6	Secretary of Health and Human Services shall seek to						
7	enter into an agreement with the State of Utah under						
8	which the State will assume all responsibility for the ad-						
9	ministration within the State of Federal programs in the						
10	areas of education, transportation, and Medicaid. The						
11	State's administration of the programs shall not be subject						
12	to oversight or regulation by the Secretaries so as to per-						
13	mit the State to undertake and evaluate innovative meth-						
14	ods to manage the programs. The agreement shall take						
15	effect on the first day of the first calendar year beginning						
16	after the date of the enactment of this Act.						
17	(b) RETURN OF TAX REVENUES TO STATE.—If the						
18	agreement authorized by subsection (a) is entered into by						
19	the State of Utah, at the beginning of each calendar year						
20	thereafter, the Secretary of the Treasury shall transfer to						
21	the State of Utah an amount equal to that portion of the						
22	estimated tax revenues to be paid by citizens of Utah for						
23	that calendar year that would be returned to the State						
24	through Federal education, transportation, and Medicaid						
25	programs in the absence of the agreement. If the estimate						
26	for a calendar year results in an overpayment or under-						

- 1 payment to the State, the Secretary of the Treasury shall
- 2 adjust the payment for the next calendar year to recover
- 3 the amount of the overpayment or correct the under-
- 4 payment.
