
1. Reference (a) requested issuance of a license to cover the reconstruction, maintenance and use by the U.S. Forest Service of an existing road crossing over subject railroad. Use of the crossing will greatly improve access to Forest Service lands in the vicinity of the railroad right-ofway. Enclosure (1) shows the location of the road crossing.

- 2. Subject railroad is currently leased to the Camp Lejeune Railroad Company. Article 16 of Lease NOm-71659 reserves to the Government the right to construct and maintain road crossings over the railroad. Accordingly, subject to Base concurrence, it is proposed to issue the requested license to the Forest Service.
- 3. Enclosure (2) is forwarded for review. The license restricts use of the road crossing to the Forest Service and its contractors and provides that the crossing shall be constructed in accordance with plans approved by the Base. Point of contact regarding construction plans is Mr. Joe Moore, USFS Asheville, North Carolina, telephone 704-258-2850, extension 602. Prior to the start of the construction, the Forest Service will be required to coordinate the work with the Camp Lejeune Railroad Company and the Base.





1. Introduction

The U.S. Forest Service, National Forests in North Carolina, Croatan Ranger District, wishes to acquire a right-of-way easement from International Paper Company. The right-of-way easement pertains to a gravel road which crosses the Marine Railroad that runs between Cherry Point Marine Corps Air Station and Camp Lejeune Marine Base.

The Forest Service wishes to acquire the right-of-way to facilitate logging on Forest Service land which lies adjacent to the subject road. Because the road has been in place for approximately 25 years, it is felt that there will be no environmental effects.

Old age of the I.P. road not withstanding, a systematic approach was used to analyze any environmental effects which might influence the area if the Forest Service chose to extend Scott Road rather than use the I.P. road.

The decision to be made is which alternative is environmentally preferable:

- a.) acquire easement for I.P. road
- b.) extend Scott Road from present location to timber stands which are to be logged
- c.) no action


Forest Service concerns included:

- 1.) destroying wildlife habitat by extending Scott Road
- 2.) building a road across wetlands
- 3.) providing long-term access

II. Affected Environment

This section of the report describes the environmental components of the area that would affect and that would be affected by the alternatives if implemented.

- A.) The area through which the existing I.P. road runs is "high-sight" timber land composed of longleaf and loblolly pine.
- B.) The area through which the Scott Road extension would have to run is solid pocosin and wetlands. The featured wildlife species is black bear.
- C.) There were no sites within the area listed on the National Register of Historic Places or recommended for nomination.
- D.) No rare or endangered plant or animal species are known to exist in the project area.



III. Evaluation Criteria

These are the criteria that were used in evaluating the alternatives. They were developed in terms of the opportunities, public issues, and Forest Service concerns discussed in the introduction.

A.) Provide long-term access either by acquiring an easement from I.P. or by extending Scott Road.

B.) Maintain black bear habitat

Meeting this criteria requires maintenance of the already existing black bear habitat. By extending Scott Road through the bear habitat, the continuity of large undisturbed areas would be broken.

C.) Refrain from development in the wetlands.

IV. Alternatives Considered

This section of the report includes a description of each alternative considered.

Alternatives were developed from interdisciplinary input received during the analysis process.

Alternative A

Use existing I.P. road which crosses Marine Railroad at Milepost 28. This alternative would be the most simple proposal to manage. No roads would have to be extended and no extra distances would have to be traveled.

Alternative B


Extend the Scott Road through the wetland area previously discussed. This alternative would necessitate the construction of a road through wetlands and black bear habitat. Both the crossing of wetlands and the disturbance of black bear habitat do not meet with Forest Service approval.

Alternative C - No Action

This alternative would consist of not acquiring the I.P. road easement and not extending the Scott Road to within reach of the area to be logged. By choosing this alternative there would be no timber harvested, no silvicultural treatments, or wildlife habitat treatments.

V. Effects of Implementation

This section of the report describes the consequences of implementing each alternative. It describes the environmental effects of implementing each alternative in terms of production, costs, and environmental changes.



The environmental consequences of implementing each alternative are as follows.

Alternative A - Use existing International Paper Road which crosses Marine Railroad at Milepost 28.

Adverse Effects:

There would be no adverse effects because the road has been in existence for approximately 25 years.

Other Effects:

Obtaining this easement would provide long-term access into a previously unroaded area. Obtaining this easement would provide for utilization of timber-access to perform cultural treatments-access to perform wildlife habitat improvements. Obtaining this easement would nullify the necessity of extending Scott Road through difficult terrain. Obtaining this easement would nullify the necessity of disturbing a wetland area, and disturbing black bear habitat.

Alternative. B - Extend the Scott Road.

Adverse effects:

This alternative would be a costly undertaking because it would require the crossing of very unstable pocosin swamp land. This alternative would require the disturbance of "Wetlands" which is prohibited by law. This alternative would disturb valuable black bear habitat.

Other effects:


Road construction would provide long-term access into a previously unroaded area. Road construction would provide for utilization of timber; access to perform cultural treatments, and wildlife habitat improvements after sales. This proposal would provide an economic return to the community through the subsequent timber sales that would be hauled over this road.

Alternative C - No Action

Adverse effects:

No economic returns to the community would occur.

No action would delay timber management of this area. Continuation of this management alternative would result in loss of timber through decay, no utilization of timber resources, no opportunities to provide wildlife habitat diversity and no access if wildfires or insect and/or disease outbreaks would occur.



Other effects:

Soil erosion caused by soil disturbance through construction of Scott Road extension would not occur. Visual impacts, disturbance of wildlife habitat and the need for road maintenance would not occur.

No money would be expended.

VI. Identification of Forest Service Preferred Alternative


This section indentifies the Forest Service's preferred alternative and explains why it is recommended.

Alternative A is the preferred alternative, because it negates the need to extend Scott Road, and no environmental damage would be done by acquiring an easement on an existing road.

Easement Of I.P. Road Which Crosses Marine R.R. at Mile Post 28

USDA - Forest Service National Forests in North Carolina Croatan Ranger District

An Environmental Assessment Report that discusses the obtaining of an easement from International Paper Company for a road that crosses the Marine Railroad at Milepost 2δ is available for public review in the District Ranger's Office, U.S. Forest Service, New Bern, NC.

Based on the analysis and evaluation described in the environmental assessment, it is my decision to adopt Alternative A for the actions proposed. This action calls for the acquiring of an easement to a road owned by International Paper Co. By acquiring this easement, the construction of a road through wetlands will be avoided. The disturbance of black bear habitat will be avoided. No funds will have to be expended constructing a new road.

Alternative A, provides the best combination of physical, biological, social, and economic benefits and is considered to be the environmentally preferable alternative.

I have determined, based on the environmental analysis, that this is not a major federal action that would significantly affect the quality of the human environment; therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement is not needed. This determination was made considering the following factors:


- a) economic considerations

- d) no known threatened and endangered species or archaeological sites are present




SURVEY OF PROPOSED ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY TO BE PURCHASED BY THE U.S.A.
