1. Reference (a) requested adviee concerning the responsibility for relocation of the Government railroad signale necessitated by the propose d widenting of the County road eatending from Naysville, North Garolina through the Black Swamp section to North Carolina Highway 24.
2. Reference (b) and the files of this office have been reviewed but no data has been found which will support authorization to the Covernment for the construction, operation and maintenance of the railroad signals In their present 2ocation. Accordingty, to facilitate a decision as to the responsibility for the relocation of these signals, it is requested that copies of the following instuments be forwarded to this office for revien as soon as practicablet
a. Permit or other Agreement fram the United States Forestry Service to Dopartment of the Navy authorizing construction of the Govermment railroad over the lands of the grantos.
b. Fasenent from the United States Forestry Service to State of North Carolina for the 60 foot righteof-way conmented upon in paragraph 3 of reference (a).
e. Perndt or other Agreement between the State of North Carolina and the Government authoriging the construction of the Government-owned raile road over the 3tate HI ghvsy Commission's right-of-way.
d. Any Permit or Agreement covering the construction, operation and maintenance of the Coverrment-owned railroad signals within the State's xight-of-way.
