


SECTION C - DESCRIPTION/SPECIFICATIONS/WORK STATEMENT

GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS

C-1

- C-1.1 The Contractor shall furnish the circulating parts cleaners, immersion cleaners, cleaning solvent and supplies, the servicing of the equipment (both rental and government owned), except as provided herein as government furnished to perform services at Camp Lejeune, NC, and its satellite activities in Section C-1.6.3, and the disposal of the used solvent. Equipment includes types of equipment listed in Section B2. Performance shall be in accordance with this work statement.
- C-1.1.2 Permits and Responsibilities: The Contractor shall, without additional expense to the government, be responsible for obtaining any necessary licenses and permits, and for complying with any applicable Federal, State and Municipal laws, codes and regulations in connection with the performance of the work.
- C-1.1.3 Equipment: The Contractor shall submit proof that the equipment he proposes to furnish conforms to Underwriters Laboratories standard. The Label or Listing of Underwriters Laboratories will be accepted as evidence of conforming to this requirement or independent proof satisfactory to the procuring activity that the equipment conforms to the published standard of Underwriters Laboratories.
- C-1.1.4 Composition: In the event the solvent provided under this contract meets the classification as being a hazardous waste, the RCRA rules and regulations apply for utilizing the Uniform Hazardous Waste Manifest System. The transporter of the used solvent shall be licensed by applicable State/Federal Regulatory Agency(s) and the recycler, treatment and/or disposal facility must be a State/Federal licensed and approved facility with proper State/Federal identification numbers.
- C-1.1.5 Environmental: The hazardous Waste Manifest must be signed by the actvity generating the hazardous waste. The authority to sign and date the Hazardous Waste Manifest for the generating activity will be handled by Traffic Management Office, Building 1011, Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina.



- C-1.2.1 Under this contract the Government has the right to restrict the employment of any Contractor employee or prospective Contractor employee who is identified as a potential threat to the Health, Safety, Security, general well-being or operational mission of the installation and its population.
