The purpose of this letter is to furnish additional information required in order to receive a 404 Permit from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for the Marine Corps Base's proposed project to upgrade two existing landing ramps used by tactical amphibious track vehicles entering and exiting from New River.

It appears that concurrence from your office is the only remaining consideration to be addressed. Accordingly, a consistency statement is enclosed for your review. The Base Public Works Officer is unable to obtain final approval from Headquarters Marine Corps until the 404 Permit has been obtained. If possible, it is respectively requested this matter be expedited as Marine Corps Base is approaching funding deadlines for fiscal year 1980.

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

CONSISTENCY STATEMENT AMPHIBIOUS RAMP PROJECT, CAMP LEJEUNE, NORTH CAROLINA

A. <u>Project Description</u>: This project will provide concrete ramps and erosion control measures at existing dirt ramps used for access to New River by amphibious track vehicles. One ramp will be located at the end of Rhodes Point Road on the west side of New River. The second ramp will be located at the end of Wiel Point Road on the east side of New River just south of the mouth of French's Creek.

B. <u>Purpose of Project</u>: To correct existing erosion problems caused by surface runoff.

C. Land Use: No change in land use is proposed. No marsh or wetland vegetation will be disturbed.

D. Archaeological and Historic Values: The project was reviewed by Dr. Thomas Loftfield, Department of Sociology, University of North Carolina at Wilmington. The site near French's Creek has no significant values in the immediate vicinity of the project. Significant archaeological materials were located up and down stream from the Rhodes Point road site. The Rhodes Point construction will be held within the existing road right-of-way and will not impact on the archaeological and historical value of the site. In fact, the project will protect the site against accelerated erosion. See Attachment #1.

E. <u>Alternatives</u>: There is no available alternative other than no action. The use of both roads by track vehicles is an essential part of training and has been conducted since the base was established.

F. <u>Areas of Environmental Concern</u>: The project will protect estuarine shoreline. No acceleration of intensity of traffic is foreseen; therefore, the project should greatly enhance the environment of the immediate area of each ramp.

G. <u>Onslow County Land Use Plan</u>: While the Marine Corps Base was excluded from the county plan, the waters of New River were not. This project will enhance the protection of water quality by controlling erosion and sedimentation. Therefore, it is concluded that this project is consistent with Onslow County Land Use Plan.


H. Other Requirements:

1. A 404 permit has been requested from the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, Wilmington, North Carolina.

2. The project effects compliance with the intent of the North Carolina Sedimentation Pollution Control Act of 1973. No permit is required since less than one acre of soil is exposed during construction. The area will be stabilized after ramp construction.


3. The certification from the North Carolina Division of Environmental Management pursuant to Section 401 of the Federal Clean Water Act has been obtained. See attachment #2.

4. The project will not impact on any threatened or endangered plant or animal species protected by federal and state regulations.



I. <u>Conclusion</u>: This project is consistent with the North Carolina Coastal Management Program.

CONDITIONS OF CERTIFICATION:

1. That the activity be conducted in such a manner as to prevent significant increases in turbidity outside the area of construction or construction-related discharge (increases of 25 JTU's or less are not considered significant).


Violations of any conditions herein set forth shall result in revocation of this Certification.






