





- 2. The mission of the Division and its subordinate commands is predicated upon amphibious operations. If we are truly going to train the way we expect to fight and make Camp Lejeune the "World's most complete amphibious training base," landing craft of the type we expect to utilize during amphibious operations must be made available at Camp Lejeune.
- 3. While it is recognized that the budget constraints and basing/strategic homeporting process is long and involved, the present time would appear to be ideal to propose addition of this valuable training asset at Camp Lejeune. This headquarters proposes an initial joint study of the feasibility of permanently basing a Landing Craft Unit composed of eight (8) LCU's at Camp Lejeune. The commands directly involved in the project would be the Second Marine Division and Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune.
- 4. This headquarters requests that CG, FMFLant begin a study along the lines provided above, with the goal of establishing an assault craft unit based permanently at Camp Lejeune.
