



#### CERTIFICATION

THIS CERTIFICATION is issued in conformity with the requirements of Public Laws 92-500 and 95-217 of the United States and subject to the North Carolina Division of Environmental Management Regulations in 15 NCAC 2H, Section .0500 to the U.S. Marine Corps, Camp Lejeune, pursuant to the application filed on the 7th day of January, 1980, for the discharge of fill material into the waters of the New River.

The application provides adequate assurance that the discharge in conjunction with the construction of two-concrete amphibious ramps at Weil Point and Rhodes Point in Onslow County will not result in a violation of applicable water quality standards. Therefore, the State of North Carolina certifies that this activity will not violate Sections 301, 302, 303, 306, 307 of PL 92-500 and PL 95-217 if conducted in accordance with the application and conditions hereinafter set forth.

### CONDITIONS OF CERTIFICATION:

1. That the activity be conducted in such a manner as to prevent significant increases in turbidity outside the area of construction or construction-related discharge (increases of 25 JTU's or less are not considered significant).


Violations of any conditions herein set forth shall result in revocation of this Certification.



Therefore, the State of North Carolina certifies that this activity will not violate Sections 301, 302, 303, 306, 307 of PL 92-500 and PL 95-217 if conducted in accordance with the application and conditions hereinafter set forth.

### CONDITIONS OF CERTIFICATION:

- 1. That the activity be conducted in such a manner as to prevent significant increases in turbidity outside the area of construction or construction-related discharge (increases of 25 JTU's or less are not considered significant).
- 2. That the rip-rap must be free of fines, sediments, or other trash and be of such size so as not to be suseptible to erosion or transport from the site by wave action.

Violations of any conditions herein set forth shall result in revocation of this Certification.
