

- 1. The enclosure has been reviewed for consistency with references (a) and (b). The proposed action, as described in the enclosure, will require that an Environmental Assessment (EA) be prepared and submitted to Head-quarters Marine Corps EIRB for the following reasons:
- a. The action will have major impact on red-cockaded woodpeckers, an endangered species, (see para. 5b(2)(n)) of reference (b).
- b. Use of proposed trails through protected wetlands (see para. 5b(2)(r)) will require fill material and/or drainage.
- 2. In addition, formal consultation with U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service will be required.
- 3. It is recommended that the enclosure be returned to the Assistant Chief of Staff, Training, with the following recommendations:
- a. An additional alternative be evaluated for providing the training requested in the enclosure.
- b. That the PEA be revised to more clearly describe the action and how the sponsor proposes to deal with the impact on the extensive wetlands in the area and the red-cockaded woodpecker.





Preliminary Environmental Assessment

- 1. Action/Projection Description. The purpose of the new tank trails and tank pad is to provide access for mech/counter mech operations in the LZ Dove and LZ Dodo areas. The new trails will be located within Grid Squares 8529, 8629, 8630, 8728, 8729, 8730, 8828, 8829, 8830, 8831 and along side of Marines Road (See overlay). The new tracked vehicle crossing pad is to be constructed at Gd 845292. Lack of tank trails and pad in the aforementioned areas seriously restrict the mech/counter mech training for the 2d Marine Division aboard Camp Lejeune.
- 2. Consideration of Alternatives and Site Selections. There are no feasible alternate sites under consideration at this time.
- 3. Compliance with Federal, State and Local Environmental Regulations and Guidelines.
- a. Endangered Species Act. Use of the cleared area by endangered species of animals (primarily the red-cocaded woodpecker) appears to be insignificant. This project has no apparent beneficial or adverse impact on any endangered or threatened species.
- b. Clear Water Act. Routine use of the area is of short duration and sanitary facilities are not required.
 - c. Clear Air Act. Not applicable.
- d. Coastal Zone Management Act. There is no direct or indirect impact on tidal marshes, beaches or other protected areas.
- e. Archaeological and Historic Preservation Act. There are no structures in the immediate area which have been identified on state or national registers of historic sites. There are no visible remant structures of homesites, artificats, etc., which indicate that the site is covered by this Act.
 - f. North Carolina Erosion and Sedimentation Regulations. Not applicable.
 - g. Hazardous Materials and Hazardous Waste Disposable. Not applicable.
- h. Protection of Wetlands, Executive Order 11990. Two small fresh water ponds are the only wetlands which the proposed action has the potential for impacting. A barrier of 100ft (plus) can be left around these areas affording them adequate protection as required by the Executive Order.
 - i. Sanitary Waste and Refuse Disposal. Not applicable.
- j. Discuss Other Regulations Applicable. The proposed action does not involve any additional environmental regulations.
- k. Permit Required. A permit will probably be required from the State of N.C. for the construction of the tank pad on highway 172.




MANAPOTT of Base Facilities. The proposed action is consistent with the existing and projected usage of the surrounding area.


