

1. Recommend approval of the request in the reference. The water sampling will help answer questions about which source of pollution has the greater impact on New River: point-source (sewage discharges) or nonpoint source (storm water runoff). Several years (3-5) of data must be taken by the State at this station to accurately reflect a trend in water quality conditions.

2. Our ongoing monitoring efforts at nine stations on New River are being reviewed by NCDEM and Base staff as part of the process of renewal of our sewage permit. NCDEM has suggested reducing the number of MCB sampling events, but increasing the number of compounds measured. We are evaluating the State's suggestion. Combined with the Wallace Creek data, the State and MCB can cooperatively assess the long-term impacts on New River water quality.

3. The enclosure is our proposed response to the State.
