1. <u>Purpose</u>. To promulgate information concerning the recycling of selected waste materials as established by reference (a).

2. Cancellation. BO 4100.8.

### 3. Background

- a. As technology improves our standard of living, the volume of our material wasce increases. However, waste material can be recycled to reduce the unnecessary depletion of our natural resources. Additionally, proceeds from the sale of recyclable materials are returned to this activity to offset collection costs and to finance other environmental projects.
- D. At the Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune complex, a waste recovery program is in effect to recycle items of waste material, specifically corrugated cardboard, newspaper, scrap iron and waste oil products.
- c. Normal procedures for refuse collection/disposal are contained in reference (p).
- d. The recovery of used POL's and other types of hazardous materials and related collection and turn-in procedures are contained in references (c) and (d).

## 4. Responsibilities

#### a. Area Commanders/Commanding Officers:

- (1) Provide adequate policing of areas around collection stations.
- (2) Ensure that designated users call extension 2636 to report full containers (cardboard and scrap iron only) to prevent the unsigntly accumulation of waste material outside the dumpster.
- (3) Ensure that users separate waste material by category and that waste material is deposited in the appropriate container.


## o. Base Maintenance Officer:

- (1) Ensure that cardboard and scrap iron containers are emptied on a scheduled pasis sufficient to prevent overflow and that dumpster contents are delivered to the proper recovery agency.
  - (2) Provide for the maintenance and repair of dumpster containers.

# 5. Recovery of Corrugated Cardooard Material

a. <u>Definition</u>. Corrugated cardboard is that material used as snipping containers which is free of bonding and sealer material such as tar. Cardboard containing a bonding/sealer material <u>cannot</u> be recycled.





b. Collection Containers. Containers are painted green with white lettering ring "CORNJGATED CARDBOARD ONLY." These containers have been placed to provide the users with convenient locations. Other users may deposit corrugated cardboard in these containers.

- b. Collection Containers. Containers are painted red, white and plue. These containers have been placed to provide convenient deposit drops for users. Majazines and glossy paper inserts should not be deposited in these containers.


