- 1. Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune, NC, Navy Boat Crew element of UIC 67001 has acquired additions to boat allowance of one 36 foot Landing Craft Personnel (LCPL) and in September 1984 will receive one LCM-8. Additional operating crew and high intensity maintenance support personnel are necessary to meet mission requirements. Enclosure (2) lists 9 uncompensated billets without a prioritized list which comprise crew staffing. The crew leader 5-9 billet is compensated for by the present 5-7 billet and is prioritized for POM 87.
- 2. The Navy Boat Crew performs a vital mission within the Range Control Section aboard Camp Lejeune. Primarily, the Boat Crew is required to patrol and block the many waterways using small boats to disallow passage for civilian crafts through channels, rivers, or hazardous waters during live firing and merial gunnery/ bombardment. Additionally, during parachute operations the Navy Boat Crew provides safety boats to retrieve personnel/cargo that accidentally land in the water. Rescue operations/assistance often extend over many hours of inter-agency cooperative effort. Furthermore, nearly all amphibious training exercises require support from the boat crews. Nobilization incremented requirements are requested to be established as provided for in Chapter 7 of reference (a) based upon functional equations derived from an increase in operating hours from the present of 180 hours per week to 360 hours at NT1 and to 675 hours at NT2.
- 3. Request enclosures (1) through (3) be reviewed and approved for manning acquisition fiscal year 85. The compensated crew leader billet change is requested not later than PON 87.

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


- 1. Currently, we have six aluminum and fiberglass boats ranging in size from 14 to 18 feet and just recently received a 36 foot LCPL. Next month we are scheduled to receive an LCM-8. Presently, our three enginemen are maintaining six OMC-35 horse-power motors and supervising the material maintenance of the six small boats and the newly acquired, maintenance intensive LCPL.
- 2. With the addition of the LCM-8 and the LCPL, two additional EN3's are the minimum required to maintain and operate these boats in order to accomplish our expanding mission and tasks. Working hours are being extended from 0500 through 2300 due to recent range renovations and additions, and new equipment, weapons, tactics, and training requirements/doctrine which require longer, more extensive training maneuvers and exercises.
- 3. The LCM-8 will require a crew of one EN, one BM, and two SN at all times during its operation, which is projected as significant. Specifically, the LCM-8 could be waterborne daily throughout the training week. The Boatswain Mates must be saltwater qualified coxswains due to beach landing operations.
- 4. The supply clerk billet is likewise essential for mission accomplishment. The expanded role of the boat crew requires extensive requisitioning and control/accountability of new parts and materials needed to maintain the LCM-8, LCPL, and other small craft. The receipt, storage, inventory and issue functions mandate a qualified supply person.
- 5. Corresponding to the above increases in mission and scope of operations for the Navy Boat Crew, the need exists to upgrade our BMC billet to that of BMCM. The boat crew's leading CFO will be required to lead, manage, and control additional personnel and assets and will be dealing with senior ranking personnel on a constant, continuing basis. His administrative expertise and experience are essential.

1. In accordance with reference (a), it is requested that the following changes to the manpower authorization for Navy Boat Crew UIC 67001 are reflected for the reasons stated below. The Navy Boat Crew is staffed under the title of Marine Corps Base.

2. The Navy Boat Crew's role is of a significant nature, that in which the Navy Boat Crew plays a vital part in base training on the firing ranges by blocking the waterways with the small boats to disallow passage of civilian crafts throught the channels while firing is in progress. During parachute operations, the Navy Boat Crew is tasked with providing a safety boat to pick up personnel/cargo that accidentally land in the water. Currently, we have six (6) aluminum and fiberglass boats ranging in size from 14' to 18'. By April 30, 1984, the Base will receive a LCM-8 and a LCPL. Presently, our three (3) enginemen are maintaining six (6) OMC-35 horsepower motors and supervising the material maintenance of the six (6) aluminum and fiberglass boats. With the addition of the LCM-8 and the LCPL, we need an additional two (2) EN3's to help maintain and operate these boats. Working hours will be extended from 0500 through 2300 because of the

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change of equipment which will allow for longer, more extensive maneuvers. The LCM-8, once onboard, will require a crew consisting of one (1) EN, one (1) BM, and two (2) SN at all times during it's operation and the LCPL will require one (1) EN, one (1) BM, and one (1) SN. There is a requirement that the Boatswain Mates be saltwater qualified coxswains for the purpose of beach landing operators. It is requested that our BMC billet be upgraded to that of an BMCM due to the increase in personnel, and the fact that he will be dealing with senior ranking personnel on a constant basis and his administrative expertise is needed.

The Supply Clerk's billet is needed for the requisitioning of new parts and material needed to maintain the LCM-8 and LCPL along with the other small crafts. The job would be receipt, storage and inventory of all stock.
