Provide space for administration purposes and data processing equipment including raised flooring, fire protection, and heating, ventilation, air conditioning as required. Provide all utilities to site. Air Conditioning: 25 Ton.

PROJECT: Provide a distribution facility with administration and data processing space for the Regional East Coast Commissary Complex.

REQUIREMENT: The East Coast Commissary Complex directs the operations of a central inventory control office, complex distribution center (warehousing), and data processing services for the complex based upon policies and guidance provided by the Commandant of the Marine Corps.


The Complex distribution facility will provide the above services to the Commissaries at Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina; Marine Corps Air Station (Helicopter), New River, North Carolina; Marine Corps Air Station, Cherry Point, North Carolina; Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island, South Carolina; Marine Corps Logistics Base, Albany, Seorgia; Marine Corps Development and Education Center, Quantico, Virginia.

(Ref) Intraservice Support Agreement No. M31000-82274-01, between the Commanding General, Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina and the Regional East Coast Commissary Complex dated 9/21/82.

CURRENT SITUATION: In late 1982, the Regional East Coast Commissary Complex was established to provide distribution for commissaries at Camp Lejeune, NC; New River, NC; and Parris Island, SC. Additionally in calendar year 1985, distribution services will be expanded to include Quantico, VA and Albany, GA. At its inception the Regional East Coast Commissary Complex was located in the Industrial Area of Hadnot Point. Building 1201, a warehouse of 66,800 SF, is being utilized to help satisfy storage requirements and 4,500 SF is being utilized in Building 1301, a warehouse, for administrative functions. Buildings 1201 and 1301 are located adjacent to each other with heavy traveled thoroughfares between and in front. Also located in the same general area is Building 1200 which is Hadnot Point Commissary. This incompatible mix of heavy industrial and personal motor vehicle traffic creates traffic congestion with attendant safety hazards. For this reason and the expanded distribution requirements, a new expanded distribution complex is required.

IMPACT IF NOT PROVIDED: Current inefficiency of operations, traffic congestions and safety hazards will worsen. Due to inadequate warehousing requirements, the Regional East Coast Commissay Complex cannot adequately perform their intended mission to support their customers.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: *The 66,800 SF, Building 1201 shown as adequate is inadequate due to location for purposes of this project. It is however, adequate warehouse space and will revert back to Fleet Marine Force/Marine Corps Base units. The 4,500 SF in Building 1301, shown as inadequate, will revert back to its intended use as adequate warehouse space.
