

Subj: Tennis Court Surface Deterioration



- References (a) and (b) advised of problems with tennis court surfaces at AS-2006 and AS-1004, and requested an engineering evaluation to determine the cause of surface deterioration.
- 2. These courts were built in the early 1970s as general purpose playing courts and were constructed of concrete. They were subsequently converted to tennis courts and the latest resurfacing was accomplished under Contract N62470-76-B-0761 which was accepted as usably complete on 2 Oct 1978. The work in this contract included application of new wearing surfaces including relatively thin layers of binder, resurface material and color coats. These materials are now peeling away from the concrete surface on portions of the court and in many areas there are water and air bubbles between the concrete and the wearing surfaces.
- 3. The existing courts are uneven and contain many small depressions which hold water after a rain. The courts are not adequately sloped for drainage and in some areas the surfaces are lower then the adjacent ground surface. In addition, the courts were build without a vapor barrier to prevent movement of moisture from the ground up through the concrete.
- 4. It is considered that the primary causes of premature surface deterioration are inadequate drainage, lack of vapor barrier and court construction with concrete. These factors prevent maintenance of a proper bond between the concrete and the wearing surface. To correct the problem, it will be necessary to completely remove the wearing surfaces down to the concrete and to resurface the courts with approximately two inches of asphalt to provide proper drainage and a suitable base for new wearing surfaces.
- 5. It is planned to include correction of this problem and resurfacing of both courts in a contract that is scheduled to be designed and awarded in the summer of 1981.




