



8 August 1982	Major Joseph S. HACK, Jr., assumed duties as the Facilities Maintenance Management Officer vice Major James A. MARAPOTI.
12 Aug 1982	Colonel John T. MARSHALL assumed duties as Assistant Chief of Staff, Facilities, vice Colonel Kenneth P. MILLICE, Jr.
8 October 1982	Master Sergeant James R. BAYSINGER assumed duties as Facilities Chief vice Master Sergeant Paul W. HARRINGTON.
31 October 1982	Mr. Robert E. ALEXANDER reported to duty as Environmental Engineer, a new billet (GS-12) approved during this period.
l December 1982	Staff Sergeant Joseph O. HARRIS, Jr., was selected for the Warrant Officer Program. He departed for his new unit on 15 December 1982




BASE MAINTENANCE DIVISION


- 20 July 1982 Solid Waste Permit Number 67-03 was issued by the North Carolina Division of Health Services. The permit authorizes the operation of the Base Sanitary Landfill.
- 1 October 1982 The Natural Resources and Environmental Affairs Branch was transferred from the Base Maintenance Division and placed under the direct cognizance of the Assistant Chief of Staff, Facilities.
- 4 October 1982 Work commenced to design data processing systems for support of the Base Maintenance Division. Study and analysis of systems requirements were begun in the Operations Branch.
- 29 October 1982 A project for rehabilitation of Marston Pavilion, Building 730 was completed at a cost of approximately \$58,000. The project included acoustical dropped ceilings, ceiling fan installations, lighting modernization and heating system renovation in the ballrooms. The renovation will enable significantly increased use of the facility for large social gatherings.


19 November 1982 A hazardous waste storage facility, Building Numbers TP-451 and TP-863, was completed by the joint efforts of Base Maintenance and troop training personnel at a cost of approximately \$57,223. The project consisted of repairs to one metal building and erection of another similar building in compliance with EPA regulations for storage and handling of hazardous wastes. The facility will be operated by Defense Property Disposal Office as a hazardous waste disposal site for the Camp Lejeune/Marine Corps Air Station (Helicopter) complex.

17 December 1982 A contract was awarded to McLean Contracting Company, Baltimore, Maryland on 17 December 1182 for repairs to the Onslow Beach Bridge. The bridge was struck by the tugboat Captain Mash on 1 October 1982, causing misalignment of the pedestal bearing.
