



- 1. Reference (a) requested permission to install an OA 81-12 Horn antenna on the Fire Tower located at TLZ Hawk during Solid Shield 87. Reference (b) requested that a technical evaluation be provided by this division addressing the possibility of the existence of radiation hazard zones to personnel working in close proximity to subject antenna.
- 2. Eighth Communication Battalion was not provided with the technical publications on subject antenna, temp loaned to them by the Air Force. As a result, specific technical data was not initially available. However, during reference (c) it was determined that no danger from microwave radiation exists to personnel.
- 3. It is the recommendation of this division that permission be granted to 8th Communication Battalion to operate the antenna from the location requested. POC is Capt P. A. Summers, ext 1661/2731.






- 1-19. RADIATION HAZARD. A diagram which shows the potential zones of radiation hazard (when operating in Tropo mode) in Table 1-5 below for an antenna with zero degree horizon angle. The following precautions apply.
- 1. Personnel must avoid exposure in a cylinderical zone directly in front of the antenna aperature to a distance of 400 ft. This zone contains points in which a power density of 10 mw/cm<sup>2</sup> is exceeded, a hazardous condition.
- 2. A secondary conical tapered zone in which the power density may be in the range of 1 to 10 mw/cm<sup>2</sup> is also shown in Figure 1-5. It is recommended that personnel not be exposed in this zone for more than one hour.
- 3. When adjusting elevation angle behind the dish, personnel must keep head below a line 2 ft. below the center of the dish. This is indicated on the equipment by a warning label and a red line on the mast.
- 1-20. If the antenna angle is declined, the beam will intercept the ground region at a distance from the antenna which depends on the amount of declination angle. Table 1-5 shows the potential hazardous range of distance from the antenna considering a height clearance of 7 ft. for personnel.






Subj: Vehicle Use; off hard surface road

1. Returned approved.

- 2. It is requested that vehicle operators be instructed to use sound judgement when traveling over the types of roads listed in the basic letter.
- 3. It is further requested that those vehicles being operated on the upper tidal zone of the beach, be washed thoroughly after each daily operation. This is necessary to prevent salt water damage to the vehicle undercarriage, braking system, universal joints etc.
- 4. In order to minimize vehicle damage caused from off hard surface road operation, the vehicles listed in enclosure (1) and (2) will be required to undergo more frequent preventive maintenance schedules. The Maintenance Branch, Base Motor Transport, will establish schedules so as to ensure minimum downtime of vehicles.
- 5. Your assistance in care, operation and maintenance of assigned vehicles will be greatly appreciated.



1. Due to the nature of the work conducted by the Natural Resources and Environmental Affairs Division, it is requested that the vehicles listed in enclosures (1) and (2) be authorized for use on secondary roads, tank trails and forest access roads which in many cases are not maintained. These roads and trails are presently restricted, as stated in the reference.

- 2. Vehicles listed in enclosure (2) must also have access to the beach area and will operate in the upper tidal zone between the months of June through October because of endangered species work which is required by the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service.
- 3. It is requested that the vehicles listed in enclosures (1) and (2) be exempt from the restriction of the reference concerning the use of these vehicles off hard surface roads.






Subj: PROPOSED ACTIONS FOR GOLD GOLF COURSE





1. During the reference, Mr. Black and Mr. Fletcher discussed the proposal of controlled burning the forested area adjacent to the Golf course. Burning of the area can be accomplished but should be accomplished between 1 December and 15 March when vegetation is dormant so damage potential is reduced.

- 2. During the period December March, the most favorable winds for controlled burning are from the northern quandrant. This would create a significant smoke management problem along Brewster Boulevard, the Scarlet Golf Course, and Officers Quarters adjacent to the golf courses, including the General Officer Quarters. The area could be burned with another wind direction, but these winds are less predictable which make a controlled burn more difficult but not impossible to manage.
- 3. During the actual burning, probably 2 days, the Gold Course would have to be closed and considerable assistance from the Base Fire Department and golf course maintenance personnel and coordination with Base Housing occupants will be required.
- 4. During the reference, it was also apparent that practically all of the timber in the area requires silvicultural treatment of some type to maintain vigor in the younger plantations and to decrease the susceptibility of older trees to Southern Pine Beetle attack.
- 5. The controlled burning and the timber harvesting (see enclosures (1) and (2)) will be temporarily unsightly, but for the long term improvement of the golf course the work should be accomplished. The timber harvesting should be done in FY-88 with the controlled burn being completed in FY-89. It is also suggested that the wooded areas of the Gold Golf Course be burned every two years.
