

Dear Ms. Jackson;

A Public Health Assessment for Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune was performed by the Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry. It identified groundwater contamination as a potential health hazard. In response to this assessment, an annual program to monitor the active supply wells was enacted.

Enclosed is a copy of the results for the wells that were resampled in 1995. These results indicate one well with a constituents above the North Carolina Administrative Code, Title 15A, Chapter 2, Subchapter 2L standards. Well GSR01 has been taken off line. The other three wells will be resampled to validate the results before additional actions are taken. l_{15} THIS TRUE ?
