Mr. HATCH (for himself and Mr. UDALL of Colorado) submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

RESOLUTION

Establishing the Committee to Reduce Government Waste.

1 Resolved,

2 SECTION 1. ESTABLISHMENT.

3 There shall be a Senate committee known as the
4 Committee to Reduce Government Waste (referred to in
5 this resolution as the "Committee").

6 SEC. 2. MEMBERSHIP.

7 (a) COMPOSITION.—The Committee shall be com-8 posed of 12 members as follows:

9 (1) Four members from the Committee on Fi10 nance, 2 selected by the majority leader and 2 se11 lected by the minority leader.

1 (2) Four members from the Committee on Ap-2 propriations, 2 selected by the majority leader and 3 2 selected by the minority leader. (3) Four members from the Committee on the 4 5 Budget, 2 selected by the majority leader and 2 se-6 lected by the minority leader. 7 (b) TENURE OF OFFICE.— 8 (1) PERIOD OF APPOINTMENT.—Members shall 9 be appointed for a period of not to exceed 6 years. (2) EXCEPTIONS.—No person shall continue to 10 11 serve as a member of the Committee after the per-12 son has ceased to be a member of the Committee 13 from which the member was chosen. 14 (c) VACANCIES.—Any vacancy in the Committee shall 15 not affect its powers, but shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment. 16 17 (d) CHAIRMAN AND VICE CHAIRMAN.—The Com-18 mittee shall select a Chairman and Vice Chairman from among its members. 19 20 (e) QUORUM.—A majority of the members of the 21 Committee shall constitute a quorum, but a lesser number 22 of members may hold hearings. The powers conferred 23 upon them by section 4 may be exercised by a majority

24 vote.

1 SEC. 3. DUTIES.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Committee shall have the fol-3 lowing duties: 4 (1) STUDY.—The Committee shall— 5 (A) research, review, and study Federal programs that are underperforming or non-6 7 essential; and 8 (B) determine which Federal programs 9 should be modified or eliminated. 10 (2) RECOMMEND.—The Committee shall de-11 velop recommendations to the Senate for action de-12 signed to modify or eliminate underperforming or 13 nonessential Federal programs. (3) REPORT AND LEGISLATION.—The Com-14 15 mittee shall submit to the Senate— 16 (A) at least once a year, reports includ-17 ing— 18 (i) a detailed statement of the find-19 ings and conclusions of the Committee; 20 and 21 (ii) a list of underperforming or non-22 essential Federal programs; and 23 (B) such legislation and administrative ac-24 tions as it considers appropriate. 25 (b) CONSIDERATION OF LEGISLATION.—Any legislation submitted to the Senate by the Committee shall be 26 •SRES 93 IS

considered under the provisions of section 310 of the Con gressional Budget Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C. 641).

3 SEC. 4. POWERS.

4 (a) HEARINGS.—The Committee or, at its direction,
5 any subcommittee or member of the Committee, may, for
6 the purpose of carrying out the provisions of section 3—

7 (1) sit and act, at any time, during the ses8 sions, recesses, and adjourned periods of Congress;
9 (2) require as the Committee considers nec10 essary, by subpoena or otherwise, the attendance of
11 witnesses and the production of books, papers, and
12 documents;

13 (3) administer oaths and take testimony; and

14 (4) procure necessary printing and binding.

(b) WITNESS ALLOWANCES AND FEES.—The provisions of section 1821 of title 28, United States Code, shall
apply to witnesses requested to appear at any hearing of
the Committee. The per diem and mileage allowances for
witnesses shall be paid from funds available to pay the
expenses of the Committee.

(c) EXPENDITURES.—The Committee, or any subcommittee thereof, is authorized to make such expenditures as it deems advisable.

1 SEC. 5. APPOINTMENT AND COMPENSATION OF STAFF.

Except as otherwise provided by law, the Committee
shall have power to appoint and fix the compensation of
the Chief of Staff of the Committee and such experts and
clerical, stenographic, and other assistants as it deems advisable.

7 SEC. 6. PAYMENT OF EXPENSES.

8 The expenses of the Committee shall be paid from9 the contingent fund of the Senate.

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
