Hiring Freeze Bill Referred To Committee; Hearing Held

U.S. Rep. Tom Marino's first bill, HR 1779, the Federal Hiring Freeze Act of 2011, is moving along in Washington.

Marino introduced the bill law-enforcement positions. on May 5 and three weeks later was asked to testify in support of the measure before the Subcommittee on Federal cited President Ronald Workforce, U.S. Postal Service and Labor Policy.

The bill was referred to the 1981 — a Presidential Committee on Oversight & Government Reform.

HR 1779 would freeze most federal hiring until the federal deficit is eliminated. The proposed freeze would affect all federal agencies but ager in a factory. allows for exceptions during times of war and for federal sitions.

In his testimony, Marino Reagan's first official act following his inauguration in Memorandum calling for an immediate freeze on the hiring of civilian employees in the executive branch.

Marino also discussed his work experience as a man-

"The fact is, we need to manage the government more like we run our businesses," and vital national security po- Marino said. "When the revenues weren't coming in, we cut our costs. One of the ways we cut our costs was by not replacing people when they left and asking the remaining employees to produce a little more.

> "And they did," he said. "This approach is what we need to do in Washington."

The congressman issued this statement: "I am very pleased that the House of Representatives listened to the voice of the people. The taxpayers are the true bankers of this country—and the bankers denied this absurd request to raise the nation's debt limit without making deep spending cuts. They said 'no' to more loans to a poor-risk President and reckless spending.

"It is difficult to imagine that anyone would even consider raising the debt ceiling at a time of record national debt and deficit, and a high unemployment rate.

"By saying no to this administration, we acted on behalf of the responsible lender the taxpayers — and denied this request."

Rep. Marino delivered the keynote address to the Dallas High School Student Leadership in Civics Club on May 15 at the East Mountain Inn. Marino told the young men and women that they've already learned one of life's most important lessons: the value of service. "If you learn that, then all other facets of your life will be enhanced," he told them. "Service work is not discriminatory; it doesn't matter if you are old or young, rich or poor," he said, noting that everyone has something to offer the community.

The congressman and other elected officials addressed the gathering at the post home and presented wreaths at the site of the monument. Marino urged the group to remember to honor veterans of all wars and all ages and thanked them for their service. He talked about his March trip to the Middle East where he visited troops and military leaders in Afghanistan and Iraq. "After meeting those young men and women in our military, I can sleep much better at night. I feel good knowing that they will come home from war and become our leaders of tomorrow. We are in good hands."
