The Protect Life Act, Co-Sponsored by Representative Kelly, Passes the House

The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, also known as Obamacare, has loopholes in it that could result in the use of taxpayer dollars to subsidize abortion.

We know that this is true because in a last- ditch effort to get reluctant pro-life Democrats to support President Obama's signature health care legislation, the president agreed to sign an Executive Order prohibiting the use of federal funds for abortion.

However, the problem with the Executive Order is that it has no teeth; the order can be rescinded by this or any future president with the mere stroke of a pen.

To ensure that federal dollars do not go toward the funding of abortion, Representative Kelly co-sponsored and voted in support of the Protect Life Act (H.R. 358), which passed the House on October 13 with bi-partisan

support by a vote of 251 to 172.

The Protect Life Act will not only amend Obamacare to statutorily prevent federal funding of abortion or abortion coverage, with exceptions in cases of rape, incest, and when the life of the mother is at stake; it will also strengthen conscience protections for health care professionals who are morally opposed to abortion. By enforcing stronger restrictions against taxpayer-subsidized abortions, the Protect Life Act will not only protect Americans' religious liberties, but will also honor the will of the American people, a majority of whom are against publicly-funded abortions.

Representative Kelly Sends Letter to the Obama Administration Demanding an End to Controversial Contraceptive Mandate

This fall, Rep. Kelly sent a letter to the secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Kathleen Sebelius, calling on her to rescind a new federal mandate requiring all health insurance plans to cover contraceptives, including those commonly referred to as "emergency contraception."

As part of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, the mandate would force employers to cover FDA-approved emergency contraception such as the highly controversial drug ulipristal acetate (ella), which shares the relevant chemical properties of the abortion drug mifepristone (RU-486). Ella has also been found to be

embryotoxic in animal studies, functioning as a progesterone receptor blocker that can prevent a newly conceived human being, post-fertilization, from implanting in the uterine lining.

This mandate forces an organization, such as Catholic Charities in Pittsburgh, to provide coverage for drugs that it considers morally objectionable and that violate the very tenets of its faith. While there is an exemption within the mandate, it is narrowly defined, and fails to protect a number of faith- based organizations. As a result, religious employers have to either provide health insurance coverage that is inimical to their basic religious beliefs; to stop providing coverage to their employees; or, in some cases, to close their doors to the communities they serve.

The mandate will take effect in August 2012.
