This week the House of Representatives voted to repeal ObamaCare. Three Democrats joined the unanimous caucus of Republicans to <u>pass</u> the repeal measure, <u>H.R. 2</u>.

Cutting Wasteful Spending

Also, this week, conservative legislators Jim Jordan, Chair of the Republican Study Committee, Scott Garrett, Chairman of the Republican Study Committee Budget and Spending Task Force and Senate Steering Committee Chair Jim DeMint, unveiled the "<u>Spending Reduction Act of</u> <u>2011</u>," which would cut \$2.5 trillion worth of federal spending.
