\$55 Million Disaster Recovery Grant from HUD for the State of Alabama

We announced that the State of Alabama will receive \$55 million in community development block grant disaster recovery funding from The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Approximately \$16.6 million will be awarded to the City of Tuscaloosa, \$6.4 million to the City of Birmingham, and \$7.8 million to Jefferson County, all of which are located in the 7th Congressional District of Alabama.
