### Sewell Introduces Southeastern Tax Relief Act

As we continue down the long road to recovery, it is critical that we provide communities with the resources and opportunities they need to repair, rebuild, and move forward. That is why on June 23, I introduced the Southeastern Tax Relief Act of 2011 with my colleague Rep. Spencer Bachus. This bipartisan disaster relief legislation will help provide tax incentives for homeowners, businesses and the agriculture industry so that they can rebuild. The bill will aid communities in their effort to rebuild and strengthen infrastructure, and it will spur investment. In conjunction with the federal assistance already provided by FEMA, the Department of Agriculture and the Small Business Administration, this legislation will help our communities recover and come out stronger than before.

## The Barber of Birmingham Premieres in Washington, DC



On June 21, our offices had the honor of co-hosting the Capitol Hill premiere of the documentary *The Barber of Birmingham: Foot Solider of the Civil Rights Movement.* The documentary chronicles the life of James Armstrong, a Birmingham barber and civil rights activist and celebrates the thousands of foot soldiers whose names are not in the history books, but on whose shoulders we all stand.

This documentary had its world premiere in January at the Sundance Film Festival and later won Best Documentary Short at the Ashland Independent Film Festival. It has been premiered in Birmingham and Selma, and will be in theatres in New York and Los Angeles in August and September.
