Statement by Congresswoman Terri A. Sewell Regarding Voting Against the House Agriculture Committee H.R. 6083, The Federal Agriculture Reform and Risk Management Act of 2012

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Today, Congresswoman Terri A. Sewell (D-AL) released the following statement after voting against the House Agriculture Committee H.R 6083, The Federal Agriculture Reform and Risk Management Act of 2012:

"Today, I voted against H.R. 6083, a bill that will have devastating consequences for more than 920,000 participants in the state of Alabama who depend on the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). Last year, my district was ranked the 5th hungriest district in America. SNAP has saved millions of lives and currently provides essential support to over 165,000 individuals in my district in Alabama alone.

This measure proposes a \$16.5 billion cut in SNAP benefits, leaving more than 2 million lowincome people without food assistance and over 280,000 low-income children without access to their free school meals. This is unconscionable! This harsh cut would disproportionately affect low-income seniors, people with disabilities and working-poor families with children.

While there is no dispute that we must make difficult budgetary decisions as our nation recovers from the worst economic recession since the Great Depression; however, we cannot do it at the expense of our most vulnerable – children and seniors. Many families and their children depend on these government assistance programs that allow them to put food on their tables and make ends meet. Now is not the time to turn our backs on American families.

I remain committed to working together with my colleagues on both sides of the aisle in Congress on passing a comprehensive farm bill that supports our nation's struggling families, low-income women, children and farmers."

Statement by Congresswoman Terri A. Sewell Regarding Voting Against the Patients' Rights Repeal Act

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Today, Congresswoman Terri A. Sewell (D-AL) released the following statement after voting against H.R. 6079 Patients' Rights Repeal Act:

"Today marked the 31st time House Republicans have voted to take away healthcare benefits instead of focusing on job creation and economic growth. With only thirteen legislative days left before summer recess, it is deeply disappointing that we must put up with this political charade that puts the health and welfare of millions of Americans in jeopardy. Frankly, the American people deserve better and my constituents expect more.

The Affordable Care Act has been passed by both the House and Senate, signed by the President and now upheld as constitutional by the highest court in the land. The American people would be better served if Congress joined the President in working to build on the healthcare reform, rather than undoing it. The fact is, the Affordable Care Act is already providing millions of Americans access to quality healthcare benefits and protections.

In the 7th Congressional District of Alabama alone, 36,000 children with pre-existing health conditions can no longer be denied coverage by their health insurers. 4,700 seniors now pay less for prescription drugs. 90,000 adults and 19,000 children will have health insurance that covers preventative care services and 6,800 young adults will continue to have access to health insurance through their parent's coverage.

In this difficult economy, where Americans are working harder for less and struggling to provide for their families, the last thing they can afford to lose is their healthcare benefits. Rather than continuing these divisive politics, we must work together to put people to work and strengthen the middle class. I remained committed to ensuring all Americans continue to have access to quality affordable healthcare.

Statement from Congresswoman Terri A. Sewell Regarding Decision to Walk Out on Partisan Attempt to hold Attorney General Eric Holder in Contempt

WASHINGTON DC, - Today, Congresswoman Terri A. Sewell (D-AL) released the following statement on her decision to walk out with the members of the Congressional Black Caucus and Democratic Caucus in response to the House Resolution contempt votes against U.S. Attorney General Eric Holder:

"Today's contempt votes were yet another example of partisan politics and an attempt by House Republicans to discredit the Obama Administration. I could not, in good conscience, participate in such deception and disservice to the American people. To simply vote against the House Resolution does not adequately demonstrate the outrage and disdain that I feel about this unfair and woefully political vote.

I am deeply troubled by this partisan attempt to distract the American people from the critical issues facing our nation. With only 17 legislative days left before summer recess, Congress should be focused on legislation that promotes job creation, protects low interest student loans and invests in our country's infrastructure.

The House Resolutions to hold the Attorney General in criminal and civil contempt reflect an abuse of power by House Republicans on the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform. This unprecedented action by House Republicans disregards the fact that there is no evidence that AG Holder authorized, condoned, or knew about gunwalking. Nor has AG Holder lied to Congress or engaged in any cover-up. On the contrary, the Attorney General has willingly complied with the Committee's request and submitted over 8,000 documents, including all the documents related to the investigation. While I support a full and thorough investigation, this process has been tainted by partisan politics.

Given the economic challenges facing the country, it is my hope that Congress will get back to the work of the American people and stop with the political gamesmanship."

Statement by Congresswoman Terri A. Sewell Regarding the Supreme Court Ruling to Uphold the Affordable Care Act

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Today, Congresswoman Terri A. Sewell (D-AL) released the following statement in response to the Supreme Court's ruling to uphold the Affordable Care Act:

"I am delighted that the Supreme Court has upheld the constitutionality of the landmark Affordable Care Act. This is a monumental victory for the American people and our country. Today's ruling confirms what I have always believed that healthcare in America should be a *right* and not a privilege. I applaud President Obama's leadership and steadfast commitment to improving the lives of our families, children and seniors.

As a result of today's decision, millions of Americans will continue to have access to healthcare benefits and protections, which are so critical to the welfare and economic stability of our nation. Because of the Affordable Care Act, Americans will no longer have to live in fear of being denied healthcare coverage because of pre-existing conditions. Millions of young people across our nation will be able to stay on their parent's insurance plans, seniors will continue paying less for their prescription drugs, and women and children will have access to vital preventative care. 33 million uninsured Americans can expect to receive quality affordable healthcare insurance without having to make the difficult choice between providing for their families or getting necessary medical treatment.

By affirming the Affordable Care Act, the 7th Congressional District of Alabama will continue to benefit from healthcare reform. In our district, 36,000 children with pre-existing health conditions can no longer be denied coverage by their health insurers, 90,000 adults and 19,000 children will have health insurance that covers preventative care services and 6,800 young adults will continue to have access to health insurance through their parent's coverage.

Recent Grant Awards

- July 10, 2012 Capital Trailways Bus is awarded \$2,011,553 through DOT/FTA for the 5311 (f) grant that assists private companies to get back into rural bus service. The grant impacts Dallas County, Tuscaloosa, Clarke and Wilcox Counties in the 7th District.
- June 22, 2012 Rural Health Medical Program in Dallas County is awarded \$650,000 by DHHS for a new rural health medical clinic to be located in Selma and it will also serve surrounding areas.
- June 19, 2012 Congresswoman Terri A. Sewell Announces \$10 Million in TIGER Grant Funding to the City of Birmingham for "Road to Recovery" Project
- June 2012 Rural Health Medical Program in Selma awarded \$650,000 from DHHS. This money will be used to convert the existing administrative location into a primary care practice that will offer primary care, OB-GYN care, and dental services.
- May 30, 2012 Alabama Transportation Rehabilitation and Improvement Program (ATRIP); ATRIP is an ALDOT administered federal aid highway program that funds up to 80% of the construction of important roadway projects. For the 7th District, \$12,137,994.78 is awarded that includes:

- Clarke County awarded \$3,920,000.00;
- Dallas County awarded \$245,366.40 & Dallas County also awarded \$479,636.00 for a 2nd project;

- Tuscaloosa awarded \$540,000.00 & Tuscaloosa awarded \$811,813.43 for 2nd project.
- May 23, 2012 The DOL awards The Dannon Project in Birmingham \$1,212,000 for Reintegration of Ex-Offender program.
