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Congresswoman Terri A. Sewell Statement on Passage of the Bipartisan Payroll Tax Cut Extension

WASHINGTON, DC –Congresswoman Terri A. Sewell (D-AL) released the following statement today after the House and Senate passed a two-month extension of the payroll tax cut, unemployment insurance, and the Medicare physician fee fix:

"Today, 160 million Americans will not see their taxes go up, nearly 24,900 Alabamians will not lose unemployment insurance while looking for work, and 48 million seniors will continue to have the medical care that they need. While our work isn't over, I applaud President Barack Obama and our House and Senate Congressional Leadership for listening to the American people. I look forward to working with my colleagues in Congress to pass long-term measures that secures the middle class, sustains health care coverage and access for our seniors and promotes economic growth and job creation."

Statement from Congresswoman Sewell in Opposition to House Republicans' Attempt to Delay the Extension of Unemployment Benefits and Payroll Tax Cuts to Americans

Washington, DC—Today, Rep. Terri A. Sewell (D-AL) released the following statement after voting against the House Republican's attempt to delay passage of an extension of unemployment benefits and payroll tax cuts:

"Today, I stood up for middle class Americans and voted against the House Republicans' attempt to delay an extension of unemployment benefits and payroll tax cuts.

The Senate amended and passed a bi-partisan bill that would have extended the payroll tax cuts for millions of workers and families, protected unemployment benefits for Americans who lost their job due to the economic recession and ensured that our seniors would have access to critical healthcare services. The agreement reflected a compromise that was negotiated in good faith by Senate Democrats and Republicans. It was overwhelmingly approved by the Senate— 89 Senators, including 39 Republicans, voted in favor of it. However, House Republicans refuse to bring this compromise to the floor for a vote.

It is unacceptable that some of my Republican colleagues in the House have once again refused to compromise. Our constituents elected us to make their lives better, not worse. This latest Republican grandstand will cost the American public dearly. As a result, 160 million middle class Americans will see a payroll tax increase, over two million Americans and almost 25,000 Alabamians will begin losing their unemployment benefits and millions of senior citizens on Medicare could find it harder to receive treatment from physicians.

We all understand that extending these benefits is a temporary fix to a long term problem. While I had hoped for a one-year extension agreement, the two-month compromise agreed to by the Senate is better than the alternative—letting millions of Americans suffer economic hardship on January 1, 2012. As members of Congress, it is absurd that we are being deprived of the opportunity to vote for a bill that would add certainty to our economy and extend these essential benefits for millions of Americans.

I am deeply disappointed in Congress's failure to put aside partisan politics. We must not go home until all Americans can celebrate the holidays knowing their benefits are protected."

Statement from Congresswoman Sewell Votes to Fund the Government, Protect Federal Programs and Provide Economic Certainty

Washington, DC—Today, Rep. Terri A. Sewell (D-AL) released the following statement after voting for H.R. 2055, the Military Construction, Veterans Affairs, and Consolidated Appropriations Act, which passed the House today by a vote of 296-121:

"Today, I voted in favor of H.R. 2055, the Military Construction, Veterans Affairs, and Consolidated Appropriations Act which will fund the government through September 2012. While not a perfect bill, this bipartisan measure will ensure that the federal government is funded through the end of the 2012 fiscal year and provide essential services for families, seniors, veterans, small businesses and our communities.

H.R. 2055 funds the government as agreed upon in the previously-passed Budget Control Act. Likewise, this bi-partisan measure does not include many controversial elements that have been a part of previous funding measures.

In these tough economic times, we must all tighten our belts and there must be shared sacrifice from everyone. This bill makes some difficult, but necessary cuts. However, it also increases funding for many programs important to families, students and workers in the 7th Congressional District, including a \$2 billion increase in Pell Grant funding and a \$2.2 billion increase for job training.

It is our responsibility in Congress to keep the Federal Government fully functioning for American families. This bill represents a long-term solution that avoids a government shutdown and allows Congress to focus on job creation and economic development."

Statement From Congresswoman Sewell on the Return of American Troops From Iraq

Washington, DC—Today, Rep. Terri A. Sewell issued the following statement on the return home of nearly all of the American forces in Iraq:

"President Obama kept his promise to end the war in Iraq. After nine years, nearly 40,000 American soldiers will be returning home in time for the holidays. America owes a tremendous debt of gratitude to the brave men and women who have risked their lives to protect and defend our freedoms.

To the members of our armed forces returning home from Iraq and their families: there is no tribute, no commemoration, no praise that can truly match the magnitude of your service and your sacrifice. You bore the ultimate sacrifice so that we all can live in a free society. You are very much a part of our nation's fabric—your strength is America's strength. I salute each one of you for your sacrifices and selfless commitment to serving America.

I know that communities in the 7th Congressional District, the State of Alabama and across this nation will welcome our troops home with open arms and a commitment to helping them transition back to civilian life. It is now our responsibility to fight for our troops like they have fought for us. We must make sure they have the care and benefits they have earned.

Well done soldiers! Welcome Home!!"

Statement from Congresswoman Terri A. Sewell on the Delay of Post Office Closures

U.S. Postal Service agrees to delay closing of any Post Office until May 1, 2012

Washington, DC—Today, Rep. Terri A. Sewell released the following statement on the United States Postal Service's (USPS) announcement that it has decided to delay closing or consolidating any Post Office or mailing facility until May 1, 2012.

"I was pleased to hear of the United States Postal Service's decision to delay the closing or consolidating any Post Offices or mailing facilities until next May. Ten Post Offices in the Seventh Congressional District and 52 across the State of Alabama were slated to close. Most of these scheduled closures are in rural areas, where access to alternative postal services is limited.

I understand that in these difficult economic times, we must all tighten our belts and there must be a shared sacrifice from everyone. However, we must ensure that the American public has access to reliable USPS services. I believe that closing Post Offices and severely hindering access to postal services in rural areas is the wrong way to go about postal reform.

The USPS's announcement of closure delays will ensure that my constituents and thousands of other communities across the State of Alabama and the nation will continue to have reliable, uninterrupted postal services. I look forward to working with my colleagues in Congress and the USPS on responsible solutions that will continue to provide access to post offices for thousands of American communities and ensure the sustainability of the United States Postal Service."

Earlier this year, approximately 3,700 post offices were targeted for closures by the USPS due to financial struggles, including mail volume declining and changing customer habits. The USPS planned to conduct studies on certain post offices to determine which facilities are subject to closure. After the announcement of closures, Congresswoman Sewell and some of her colleagues in Congress sent a letter to Postmaster General Patrick Donahoe expressing their concern over the potential closures and their importance to rural communities. Now that the deadline has been extended, this will ensure that the ten Post Offices in the Seventh Congressional District, 52 across the State of Alabama and approximately 3,700 across the nation slated for closure will remain open until at least May 1, 2012.

Statement from Congresswoman Terri A. Sewell on H.R. 3630

Washington, DC—Today, Rep. Terri A. Sewell (D-AL) released the following statement after voting against H.R. 3630:

"Today, I voted against H.R. 3630, a bill that would make drastic and harmful changes to the Emergency Unemployment Compensation program. The bill would make significant cuts to Medicare that would hurt our nation's seniors. This bill also contains political and controversial language that should be discussed and debated in separate legislation.

Before Congress breaks for the year, we need to pass a bill that solely focuses on extending relief to unemployed workers and middle class Americans who are still suffering in this recovering economy. This is no time to play with the livelihood of millions of Americans.

Our voters sent us here to make their lives better, not more difficult. We were sent here to help create jobs, stimulate the economy and protect our most vulnerable. Accomplishing these goals require a willing and compromising spirit. The folks of the 7th district of Alabama want me to put people before politics and do what is in their best interest not partisan interest. The American people expect and deserve nothing less from us! We cannot go home for the holidays until we ensure that the blessings of this holiday season can be enjoyed by all.

I look forward to voting in favor of a clean bill that extends relief to unemployed workers and payroll tax cuts to middle class families."


