USDA's D-SNAP Program

The Alabama Department of Human Resources has received approval from the U.S. government to provide food to people who otherwise might not qualify for the Food Assistance Program. Last week, eight counties accepted new D-SNAP applications. These counties included: Cullman, DeKalb, Franklin, Jefferson, Lawrence, Marshall, Tuscaloosa, and Walker. **Twelve more counties will begin accepting applications this week.** These counties include: Calhoun, Cherokee, Elmore, Etowah, Hale, Jackson, Madison, Marion, Morgan, St. Clair, Tallapoosa, and Winston. The Alabama Department of Human Resources (DHR) has scheduled Disaster Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Programs (D-SNAP) to be operated the week of May 16 – 22 for these 12 additional Alabama counties. D-SNAP is designed to provide disaster food benefits to people who might not ordinarily qualify for the Food Assistance Program. Current food assistance recipients may not apply for benefits at the D-SNAP location. The remaining 22 counties that received a federal disaster declaration will operate a D-SNAP program in the upcoming weeks. To qualify for the benefits, residents must apply in person or have an authorized representative apply for them. \$10 Million Grant to Fund Temporary Jobs for Tornado Victims

MONTGOMERY—Alabama residents who lost their jobs because of the devastating April 27 tornadoes will be eligible for new employment helping their communities recover. Gov. Robert Bentley announced a \$10 million grant from the U.S. Department of Labor that will be used to hire temporary workers to help local governments in the hardest hit areas. The workers will clear debris and start the rebuilding process and also may staff shelters and food banks. "The April 27 tornadoes left a path of devastation that not only included lives and properties, but also jobs," Bentley said. "This grant will give both communities and unemployed workers a much-needed helping hand." County and municipal governments will work with Alabama Career Centers in their areas to find applicants who are eligible for the temporary jobs. First priority for employment will be given to workers whose employers are closed because of the tornadoes. The workers will assist with the demolition, repair, renovation and reconstruction of destroyed public facilities within the affected communities. Counties targeted for assistance in hiring temporary workers include Bibb, Calhoun, Cullman, DeKalb, Elmore, Fayette, Franklin, Hale, Jackson, Jefferson, Lawrence, Limestone, Madison, Marion, Marshall, St. Clair, Tallapoosa, Tuscaloosa and Walker. Additional counties may be included at a later date.

The Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs applied for the National Emergency Grant on April 29. Municipal and county governments should contact ADECA at (334) 242-5886 to request funding for the temporary worker program.

NEW-FEMA's Local Hire Program

In every disaster, FEMA has implemented a Local Hire Program. The HR unit has partnered with the Alabama Career Center to receive resumes from registered applicants. All applicants interested in working for FEMA as a local hire must go to the Alabama Career Center's website, https://joblink.alabama.gov/ada/default.cfm and register. The Local Hire Program, located on the 4th floor, is a restricted area. Only authorized personnel and liaisons from the departments are allowed in this area. NEW - HELP US HELP YOU: VISIT A DISASTER RECOVERY CENTER

If you have been affected by the Alabama tornadoes and have questions, there is **someone** who will listen at a disaster recovery center. Twenty-eight disaster recovery centers are **currently open** in Alabama and staffed with recovery specialists from the **Alabama Emergency Management Agency**, the **Federal Emergency Management Agency**, the **U.S. Small Business Administration** and other agencies.

By visiting one of the **centers**, you can:

- **Apply for disaster assistance** with FEMA.
- Learn about federal assistance available for temporary housing and home repairs.
- Check on the progress of an application you've already submitted.
- Get information on how to replace lost documents.
- Ask questions regarding **correspondence** from FEMA.
- <u>Find out more</u> about SBA's low-interest disaster loans or what to do if you can't afford one.
- Get help completing your SBA loan application.
- Learn more about local and state agencies that may be able to provide assistance.

Doing Business with FEMA

Program: Contracting Opportunities

Description: FEMA appreciates the interest from companies that have products

How to Apply: Vendors can register online at <u>www.FedBizOpps.gov</u> - the single

government point-of-entry for Federal Government procurement opportunities over \$25,000. Government buyers use this site to publicize their business opportunities. The FedBizOpps portal also allows commercial vendors that are seeking Federal markets for their products and services to search, monitor, and retrieve opportunities solicited by the entire Federal contracting community. In addition to the business opportunities afforded at this site, special projects and funding opportunities are also posted.

This site will provide information on contracting procedures, subcontracting opportunities, and FEMA direct contracting opportunities.

Additionally, FEMA locates vendors through the Central Contractor Registration (CCR), www.ccr.gov, which is the primary vendor database for the U.S. Federal Government. FEMA also seeks small businesses through the General Services Administration's Federal Supply Schedule program, www.gsa.gov/regions.htm, which allows agencies to buy commonly used supplies and services. Registration for each is free. Vendors may also find the Small Business Administration's website (www.sba.gov) a useful resource.

NEW-FEMA Information for Survivors of Recent Tornadoes

- The Alabama Emergency Management Agency, FEMA and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers are providing flyers to help people understand how to separate debris. The flyer is also available online:

- Homeowners may be eligible for FEMA assistance even if they have insurance. Some insurance policies do not include coverage for additional living expenses. Survivors may be eligible for temporary housing assistance until they can rebuild. They may also qualify for low-interest disaster loans for losses that are not covered by insurance or other disaster assistance programs. FEMA may be able to help those who have agreed to a settlement from their insurance and still have an unmet disaster-related need. They may have exhausted the Additional Living Expenses (ALE) provided by their insurance company.
- Applicants are being asked to let FEMA know of any updates to their application information, such as change of address or phone numbers and any insurance settlements. Call 800-621-3362 and select the "help" option.
- To find the most convenient disaster recovery center, survivors may go to http://go.usa.gov/CDc. Or call the FEMA helpline. They may also get locations through mobile devices at m.fema.gov.
- Through the FEMA Housing Portal, individuals and families who have been displaced by a disaster can find a place to live. The website address is www.fema.gov, click on Apply for Assistance, and then click on Search for Available Housing.
